

Lent Begins on Ash Wednesday

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd, lasting for 40 days (not including Sundays), representing the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness. The imposition of ashes is often a central part of Ash Wednesday worship. Ashes have a long history in biblical and church traditions. In scripture, ashes or dust symbolize frailty or death (Gen. 18:27), sadness or mourning (Esther 4:3), judgment (Lam. 3:16), and repentance (Jonah. 3:6). Some traditions also have considered ash to be a purifying or cleansing agent. All these images are caught up in the church's use of ashes as a symbol appropriate for the beginning of Lent. In Christ's passion, we see God's judgment on evil. In our penitence, we express sorrow and repentance for our sins. In our rededication, we show that we are purified and renewed. The ashes we use at St. Mary's on Ash Wednesday are made by burning previous years' palms from Palm Sunday. Worshippers at the Ash Wednesday liturgy are invited to come forward to have the clergy make the sign of the cross on his or her forehead, saying:

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Ash Wednesday is one of only two fast days for all Episcopalians on the church calendar, and the Prayer Book calls it a Day of Obligation for the faithful to make a proper beginning of Lent by attending an Ash Wednesday liturgy. The following liturgies including the Imposition of Ashes and celebration of the Holy Eucharist on **Wednesday, February 22nd** are available to all:

From the Rector

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

The cover to this month's BellRinger draws our attention towards the pivotal words of the Ash Wednesday liturgy. I hope that you will all participate in one of the liturgies that day as part of your observance of this significant day of devotion. I assure you that a full and intentional observance of Ash Wednesday, Lent, and Holy Week will only magnify the joy for you come Easter Sunday.

Recently, I read Comfort Crisis, a NY Times Bestseller by Michael Easter. In short, it describes modern western culture's constant efforts towards greater levels of physical and emotional comfort as having reached, not only, a point of diminishing returns, but even a point of detriment to its own overall wellbeing. It is certainly a thought-provoking book.

The part of the book that comes to mind as I write today is the perspective that the author shared of a Bhutanese monk. Despite being ranked the 134th most developed nation on earth, some Japanese researchers have concluded that Bhutan is among the world's 20 happiest countries. And as counterintuitive as it may seem to some, a factor for this is that their culture is quite comfortable with the concept of death. The topic of our human mortality is not avoided. Death is not tucked away or to be avoided. Mourning is accepted to be a lengthy process deserving of proper attention, rather than to be avoided by keeping busy. The Bhutanese are encouraged to consider their own mortality several times a day!

Interestingly, Christians that follow the life of prayer that is outlined in the Book of Common Prayer, also consider their own death multiple times each day through the Daily Office services. Our creeds mention death. Our prayers lift up those who are sick and those who mourn. And it is a matter of ultimate comfort that, for the followers of Jesus, we see death as the gate to eternal life. We understand death to be the moment at which life changes, not its end. The Gospel entails an acknowledgment of death... but death does not have the final word. Thanks be to God!

One of the roles of the rector of Episcopal churches is to direct the attention of the faithful towards our own mortality. And because death is something that we ought to experience (unless Jesus' return comes first), Episcopalians are entreated to make plans for the handling of their affairs well in advance of a time of illness or crisis. At St. Mary's, there is a helpful Funeral Planning Guide that is available at the church office or online at our website's Helpful Links/Resources page. Please know that I would be humbled to speak and pray with you about these things if it would be helpful to you. The season of Lent is quite a fitting time for us all to prayerfully consider, and reconsider, these matters.

Vestry Meeting Highlights

The vestry met for its annual retreat on Friday, January 13 and Saturday, January 14. Friday's gathering included time of fellowship and trust while throwing axes at IronClad Axe Throwing Co, sharing a Sabbath-eve supper, and prayerful conversation about the joys and hopes of St. Mary's Church. On Saturday, the Rev. Canon Mollie Roberts joined the vestry as a guest speaker. Because the coming summer will be a time of clergy sabbatical, Canon Roberts led a conversation about the significance that this time is meant to have, not only for the clergy, but also for the parish family. The vestry continued discussion about its plans for worship and programming during that time. In the official vestry meeting, the vestry adopted a balanced budget for 2023 and discerned leadership roles for the various committees and commissions of the church (see pg. 5).





Journey in Faith: Christian Discipleship



Journey in Faith (JiF) is a short course that is open to all that explores the basics of the Christian Faith, Episcopal Church Anglican Tradition, and St. Mary's. It is especially appropriate for newcomers to St. Mary's and anyone considering baptism or confirmation when Bishop Skirving visits St. Mary's on Easter Sunday, April 9, 2023. Journey in Faith meets each Sunday morning during the Christian Formation Hour in the church's Parlor

(unless noted otherwise). Our primary reference books throughout the course include: Walk in Love: Episcopal Beliefs & Practices, Scott Gunn & Melody Wilson Shobe; The Holy Bible, New Revised Standard Version; The Book of Common Prayer, 1979 American Edition; and The Hymnal, 1982. Copies of the Bible, Prayer Book, and Hymnal will always be available on Sundays, and some copies of Walk in Love will be available for purchase in the parish Book Store in the new year (if you're an ereader, there is a Kindle version too).
