#### PALM SUNDAY

Palm Sunday, April 2, begins with the Holy Eucharist at 8am. Breakfast will be served in Moseley Hall at 9am, and throughout the morning, palm crosses will be made and freshly-baked hot cross buns will be enjoyed. The procession recalls Jesus' entry into Jerusalem before his Passion. At 10:30am, we will gather on the lawn near the playground for the procession. In the event of inclement weather, we will begin our procession in Moseley Hall.

#### MONDAY AND TUESDAY IN HOLY WEEK

There will be liturgies offered on Monday, April 3 at 5:30pm and Tuesday, April 4 at 7:30pm. On Monday, our worship will be a "Teaching Eucharist" during which we will discuss each part of our usual Eucharistic liturgies. This service will begin in the Nave. Tuesday's liturgy will be a deep look at Jesus's last week.. This service will be held in the All Saints' Chapel.

#### WEDNESDAY IN HOLY WEEK

On Wednesday, April 5, we will begin with our Parish Family Night supper at 6:30pm followed by a service of Tenebrae (Latin for 'Darkness' or "Shadows'). Tenebrae includes music from Taize and spoken word from the Psalms and other passages that foretell Jesus' Passion. This beautiful service, located in the Nave, offers a meditation upon, and a prelude to, the events of our Lord's life between the Last Supper and His Resurrection.

## THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM (Maundy Thursday - Easter Sunday)

#### **MAUNDY THURSDAY**

On Thursday, April 6, at 7:30pm, our Maundy Thursday liturgy will recall the institution of the Last Supper and Jesus' humble act of washing His disciples' feet. It ends with the stripping of the altar and the beginning of a vigil throughout the night. Join us for a special time of prayer and meditation, inspired by the question asked of all of us by Jesus - "Could you not watch with me one hour?" The Chapel prayer vigil follows the Maundy Thursday liturgy and ends with communion the following day at the Good Friday liturgy. All are invited to sign up for the vigil on the door to the Chapel.

#### **GOOD FRIDAY**

This service, on Friday, April 7, at noon, includes a homily, Solemn Collects, Veneration of the Cross, and Communion from the Reserved Sacrament. The Way of the Cross (Stations) will also be offered in the Nave at 5:45pm, ending the Good Friday observance.

#### THE GREAT VIGIL OF EASTER

Taking place in the Sanctuary, the Lenten observance officially ends and Easter celebration begins on Saturday evening with this liturgy, one of the most ancient and exciting of the Christian Church - the celebration of the transition from the darkness of Holy Saturday into the light of Christ's Easter Victory. The liturgy begins at 7:30pm, will last about an hour, includes the lighting of the New Fire, hymns & spiritual songs, accompanied by City Lights Jazz, renewal of baptismal vows, and will be followed by delicious cinnamon rolls!

#### **EASTER DAY & BISHOP'S VISITATION**

On Sunday, April 9, the Feast of the Resurrection of our Lord will begin with the Holy Eucharist in the Chapel at 8am. The 10:30am service is a Festal Holy Eucharist with full choir, flowering of the cross, and all the glory of Easter Morning! Bishop Skirving will preach & celebrate at both liturgies. There is also an Easter Egg Hunt for children following the service.

Life is full of decisions. Some easy (don't touch that red-hot stove-top!). Some more difficult (what school to attend or how to respond to a difficulty in life?). Some are seemingly inconsequential and some seem to carry the weight of the world. This year, March is completely engulfed in Lent and it carries many Lenten decisions, among so many others: selecting and holding spiritual disciplines, voting in <a href="Lent Madness">Lent Madness</a> (check it out!), what to prioritize in your life in order to draw closer to God. This year, for you, perhaps it also includes decisions around <a href="planning for end-of-life matters">planning for end-of-life matters</a> as last month's BellRinger invited us into this Lent. You certainly have other decisions before you each day.

I wonder: how does your faith inform your decision-making? The intentional seeking of God's guidance through prayer as well as through the Anglican approach of consulting our sources of authority (study of Scripture & the Tradition of the faithful, as well as our own God-given Reason) are often early indicators that the Gospel of Jesus has taken root in someone's heart. This shifts the focus of authority from our own preferences and opinions to faithfully seeking God's heart and striving to be obedient to God's will. Another word for this is discernment.

As you faithfully discern the decisions that are before you, know that you are in my prayers In all things, may God's will be done.

## Vestry Meeting Highlights

The vestry approved the Parochial Report reflecting the life of St. Mary's Church in 2022. It showed an increase in total active baptized membership; a wide variety of worship offerings, Christian formation & discipleship groups, and outreach ministries; the accomplishments of several major projects including the capabilities to livestream liturgies; a steady number of pledging households, and an overall increase in revenues for the operations of the church. A motion from the Finance Committee to invest some funds in 6 & 9-month CD's was approved. The vestry continues to make plans for worship offerings, programming, and other considerations during the Clergy Sabbatical to take place this summer between Pentecost & Labor Day. Long Range Planning continues with plans to improve accessibility inside and into the church as well as development of the outdoor West Lawn. The Organizational Statements for the church were affirmed to continue to guide the Vestry's work for the coming year.





#### Journey in Faith: Christian Discipleship



Journey in Faith (JiF) continues to explores the basics of the Christian Faith, Episcopal Church Anglican Tradition, and St. Mary's. It is especially appropriate for newcomers to St. Mary's and anyone considering baptism or confirmation when Bishop Skirving visits St. Mary's on Easter Sunday, April 9, 2023. Journey in Faith meets each Sunday morning during the Christian Formation Hour in the church's Parlor (unless noted otherwise). Our primary reference books throughout the course include: Walk in Love: Episcopal Beliefs & Practices, Scott Gunn & Melody Wilson Shobe; The Holy Bible, New Revised Standard Version; The Book of Common Prayer, 1979 American Edition; and The Hymnal, 1982. Copies of the Bible, Prayer Book, and Hymnal will always be available on Sundays, and some copies of Walk in Love will be available for purchase in the parish Book Store in the new year (if you're an e-reader, there is a Kindle version too).
