## 2024 CHRISTIAN EDUCATION TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

Join us for a peek inside our Christian Education Team activities during 2024. Our focus is to encourage activities that enhance and grow our opportunities for spiritual growth; provide educational opportunities in Christian studies; and to ensure a safe and protective environment for all of Central's activities.

Oversight and teaching resources are provided to Ladies Circles, Ladies Bible Studies, and Sunday School classes. Kathy Bricker is a wonderful servant in the area of teaching these studies. The Nursery program for children 0-5 is provided each Sunday under the watchful care of Erin Osborne and a devoted team of 7 volunteers who provide a second adult with the children. As the need arises, the Christian Education Team will assure classes for older children as well. Teaching materials are available for all ages, and both teachers and nursery volunteers are greatly needed. We want all children and youth to know Jesus; could you be the person to share Him with them?

We feel very proud of three growing concepts of worship in 2024. The Prayer Breakfast which meets on Friday mornings is wonderful means of fellowship and prayer under the leadership of Sandy Hart.

- Sandy's prayer journal, kept weekly, is a visible means of seeing God at work. Generally
- 10-13 people are in attendance, and everyone is welcome. Communal prayer is a powerful ministry.
- Another change in 2024 was the Ladies Retreat. Instead of a three-day out of town retreat, we revised the plan to a one-day ladies gathering for meaningful fellowship and fun. This allowed many more women to attend and enjoy. Diane Price has provided wonderful leadership in this area and would welcome ladies to step forward to help plan our 2025 gathering. We would love to see leadership for a men's retreat with similar fellowship goals. Could you take a lead?
- The third new program was the Community Children's Choir which was the vision of Minah Lee to offer children a way to be in a worship setting during church and experience the joy of music. Thanks to her leadership, the first showcase of the young singers 5-10 was in service during Christmas and seems to be a promising opportunity to welcome new families to our church.

As we provide opportunities for children, the Christian Education Team is responsible for child and vulnerable adult protection. The team assures that all adults serving as church staff, teachers or volunteers on our campus receive initial training in child protection for abuse and neglect and refresher training as required by church policy. We have assured training of nearly 50 adults who serve on our campus.


See Pam Brooks for any training needs for new staff, teachers or volunteers. We have also created a Protection brochure that is available for everyone and can be used at events.
