There was no applicant for the 2024 Pete and Gertrude Gallant Memorial Scholarship.

However there were 3 recipients from past applicants of the Pete and Gertrude Memorial Scholarships - Michael Lee, Emily Cheek, and Matthew Lee.

All three had excellent grades and were approved for another year award for this year.

Matthew Lee received his 2nd year award as the 2023 Gallant recipient. Matthew is currently attending the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and is studying toward a degree in Neuroscience.

Emily Cheek received her award as the 2022 Gallant recipient. Emily is studying for her 2nd Master's Degree at Appalachian State University. Emily is the daughter of Andy and Beverly Cheek and granddaughter of Joy Cheek.

Finally, Michael Lee received an award as the 2021 Gallant recipient. Michael is also attending the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and is studying to obtain a degree in Information Science.

Michael and Matthew are the sons of Reverend Doctor Mark and Minah Lee.

For the benefit of our new members the Pete and Gertrude Memorial Scholarships were established in 2014. The Gallants were long time members of our church and their daughter Carol Gallant has funded the scholarships in their memory. This scholarship is given to the recipient for four consecutive years provided that the student maintains acceptable grades in their field of study.

Marion Blackwelder was the daughter of Charles and Sarah Blackwelder and niece of Jack and Mae Austin, all long time members of Central Steele Creek Church. Marion was a student at Brevard College and died in an automobile accident in December 1979. The Central Steele Creek Scholarship Fund was started in 1984 as a tribute to her memory. The award is made yearly and only the interest is used to finance the scholarship, with the principal remaining untouched. Additional donations are gratefully accepted as the cost of a college education continues to rise..

# New Additions to the Fall Session

The Fall Session will be special because we will be adding the Central Children's Community Choir and informal ukulele jam sessions to our many private music lessons and group sculpture classes.

- The Central Children's Community Choir is a free choir for children in k-5 grades, directed by Minah Lee. It will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of each month, starting on September 22<sup>nd</sup>. We saw how enthusiastically the arts and music campers responded to the opportunity to sing together. Registration is on the central finearts.org website.
- Karis Lee is organizing informal ukulele jam sessions to be held on Tuesday evenings. This is open to anyone with some ukulele experience. More information will be available this fall.

The CFAA reputation for quality and affordable lessons in a caring environment is growing. Students range from kindergarten age through adults. The variety of private music lessons includes piano, voice, guitar, drums, violin, and ukulele. Sculpture is available for small group or private lessons. Most popular are piano lessons. We expect that we will see an increase in numbers over the 2023-2024 sessions which had 50 – 55 students and 60 lessons being held each week. We know that many of our campers are interested in lessons. Our director, Joni Turner, has provided strong leadership to handle this growth - in lessons, students and teachers.

Fall session which will start in August. The session will be from September 14<sup>th</sup> to December 10<sup>th</sup>. The Showcase will be on Friday, December 13<sup>th</sup>. More information will be posted at Centralfinearts.org..

### Naturally Creative: Arts and Music Camp

The Central Fine Arts Academy (CFAA) held its first Naturally Creative Arts and Music Camp on June  $17^{th} - 21^{st}$ .

The camp was designed for elementary students who are interested in the arts. We had a wonderful and diverse group of 27 students, ages 5 - 12. The children were divided into 2 groups: 5 - 7 years old and 8 - 12. Seven of the children attended on a 50% scholarship, based on financial need.

### The camp program:

The days were full.

In the morning, the students had 2 lessons: art and sculpture.

In the afternoon, the 2 music lessons (drums for all; ukulele for the older group and chimes for the younger) were followed by yoga.

The camp day ended with all the campers together for choir.

On Friday afternoon, the camp concluded with a Showcase performance and display of their art work.

It was amazing what the students learned in just a few days. This is a tribute to the students but also the teachers.

Our church members: Minah Lee (choir and chimes), Karis Lee (ukulele), Pam Murphy (sculpture) were outstanding in bringing out the best in the children. They were joined by Ian Reilly (CFAA drum & guitar instructor), Amy Spurling (art) and Michele Hoag (yoga).

### Student and parent feedback:

We were pleased on how well the campers participated in the camp activities and got along with the other campers.

Please see below some of the feedback provided by parents/ guardians.

- Loved it! From ukulele to clay
- All three children really enjoyed the camp
- My daughter enjoyed her camp experience very much. She did not have a favorite teacher as she loved and had a positive experience with all. She loved learning the chimes and we were very impressed by her sculpture and voice. We very much appreciate the affordable aspect of this camp as without that we would not be able to offer these

wonderful opportunities to our kids. The community really showed up and the diversity of this group is very much appreciated as well.

- Our daughter loved the camp, she asked me if she could go this week as well! Thank you and all the amazing teachers and lessons.

Thank you, Central members and staff who made this possible. Most of the church teams were involved in the preparation.

Key to the planning and preparation was the CFAA Board of Directors: Michele Devine, Pat Hart, Chris Knapp, Cathy Lee, and Rick Murphy.

Central was awarded a grant from the Charlotte Presbytery Hamilton Fund which allowed us to purchase ukuleles, drum sticks and arts supplies.
