## Last time, each of the eight Beatitudes that had been surveyed and observed in the Prodigal Parable were considered with these questions:

- $(1) \rightarrow$  How is this Beatitude counter-cultural or counter-intuitive?
- (2)→ If a person fits into the description of this Beatitude, what virtues would they have?
- (3)  $\rightarrow$  How do you see this Beatitude in Jesus?
- (4)→ Do you see evidence of this Beatitude in the prodigals' lives?
- (5) How do you observe this Beatitude in your life?

**①**→ Use these same questions for the "ninth" beatitude (vss 11-12). → Do you think this beatitude is any harder than the first eight? In what ways?

2 → In what ways can you identify God, or Jesus, currently (in our day) ① being insulted, ② persecuted, or ③ being lied about/persecuted?

③ → In what ways have you ① been insulted, ② persecuted, or ③ lied about/persecuted BECAUSE of Jesus?

④ → Terry said "Rejoice and be glad (under persecution, insults and lies) for great is your reward," and that the "real rejoicing – is the welcoming of the Gospel." → What does this mean?

**5 6 7**  $\rightarrow$  Extra (extra, extra) credit discussion: Jesus is announced then, and formoment until He returns, a new way, a new moment, a new culture, A NEW LIFE!  $\rightarrow$  How is that different from being told to act like a beatitude?
