- 1 What is “money” (mammon) in this context, and how does it corrupt people?

Luke 16:19-31

- 2 What do the rich man’s words in the afterlife communicate about how he views Lazarus? What might this suggest about the rich man’s views about himself and God?
- 3 The rich man was not tormented for being wealthy, nor was Lazarus rewarded for being poor. What was the reason behind where each man ended up after death?
- 4 How does the parable of the rich man and Lazarus impact you if you see yourself as the rich man?
- 5 What would increased compassion and decreased attachment to possessions change in your discipleship life?
- 6 **Extra Credit:** Referencing question 3, “where did each man end up?” What does this mean based on what we’ve learned so far?
- 7 **Extra Extra Credit:** What do you do with this?
