Combined Worship Service

As indicated on the front of the Banner, our church will host a combined worship service on Sunday night, April 30. Balboa Baptist Church and Coronado Baptist Church will join us for the evening. Music will be led by Keith Stevens, Minister of Music at Balboa. Dennis Phelps, the new pastor at Coronado, will preach. We will provide refreshments following the service.

The three churches represent a Baptist witness geographically in the Village. We are located on the west side; Coronado is in the middle, and Balboa on the east side. Our church is the oldest, with Balboa as our daughter church. Coronado was formed out of Balboa, so is our grand-daughter church, so to speak.

Barcelona Road Baptist Church initially began when a small group met in the Community Room of the POA in November 1973. Their dream was to have a Southern Baptist congregation in Hot Springs Village. The group met for more than a year without any formal organization. Then in December 1974, the Central Baptist Church of Hot Springs voted to accept the Village group as a mission congregation. On January 5, 1975, Barcelona Baptist Mission was formed. The mission was constituted as Barcelona Road Baptist Church on August 30, 1981, with 114 charter members. This means that our roots as a church go back fifty years this coming November.

We are thankful that Southern Baptists have a strong representation in the Village. It is appropriate that we gather as three churches to celebrate. I hope you will attend.

Holy Week

Palm Sunday, April 2, marks the beginning of Holy Week-the last week of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on earth. We will share the Lord's Supper and focus on the meaning of our Lord's death on the cross. Easter Sunday follows on April 9. Through music and preaching, we will focus on the resurrection of our Lord and indicate how this victorious event impacts our lives today. The title of my sermon is "The Reality of Easter" and is based on 1 Corinthians 15:1-4. Historically, Christian believers have given expression to the resurrection antiphonally: "The Lord is risen." Then the response: "He is risen, indeed." Hallelujah, what a Savior!

A Thought to Ponder

When I was called as pastor of Walnut Street Baptist Church in Louisville, Kentucky in 1986, I interviewed with a fifty-two member Pastor Search Committee. The committee was the size of lots of small churches. When I asked why the committee was so large, I was told that this was the way they had done it before.

Badgett Dillard was the Chair of that committee. He had served for many years as Administrator at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville. While he crunched numbers for a living, Dr. Dillard was a people person. When the seminary pictorial directory came out each year, he must have memorized the faces of all the students, because he called everyone by their first name. I was impressed every time we met in the hall or cafeteria and he said "Hi, Jon."


Then more than a decade later, we were meeting again, but this time with me as the prospective pastor. Sadly, during my conversations with him and the Search Committee, I learned that Badgett was dying of a fast-moving cancer. In fact, he died between the time I was called as pastor and our family moved to Louisville. He was much too young to be dying!

Shortly before his death Badgett shared the following credo with me. I still have it on a now yellowed slip of paper. "My theology will not let me complain about what is happening to me, nor to delay what is going to happen—I only hope that I will have the strength to face whatever happens when it comes."

These words have encouraged and challenged me as one day I will face my own mortality. Hopefully, they are meaningful to you as well.



The Orphan Sisters by Shirley Dickson – 1929: Four-year-old Etty and eight-year-old Dorothy are abandoned at Blakely Hall orphanage by their mother, never to see her again. With no other family to speak of, the sisters worship their beloved mam – and they are confused and heartbroken to be deserted by her when they need her the most. In 1940, Etty and Dorothy are finally released from the confines of Blakely Hall – but their freedom comes when the country is in the grip of World War Two and its terrors. Amidst a devastating backdrop of screaming air-raid sirens and cold nights huddled in shelters, the sisters are desperate to put their broken childhoods behind them. Etty and Dorothy survived the orphanage with the help of one another and neither sister can forget the awful betrayal of their mother, which has haunted them their whole lives. But when a shocking secret about their painful childhood comes to light, will the sisters ever be the same again?

The Song by Chris Fabry - Jed King's life has been shaped by the songs and mistakes of his famous father. He wants to sing his own song, but the words and melody are elusive. Haunted by the scars inflicted by his broken family, Jed's dreams of a successful music career seem out of reach . . . until he meets Rose. As romance quickly blooms, Jed pens a new song and suddenly finds himself catapulted into stardom. But with this life of fame comes temptation, the same temptation that lured his father so many years ago. Set in the fertile mid-South, this quest for success leads Jed and Rose on a journey that will force them to deal with the pain of loss, failure, and the desire to be who God created them to be. Lyrical and deeply honest, *The Song* asks the hard questions of love and forgiveness. When even the wisest of men are fools in love, can true love persevere?

<u>Forever Strong</u> -The inspirational, semi-fictional story of a wayward young rugby star who painfully overhauls his hedonistic personal values. Loosely based on a compilation of true stories associated with the famed Highland Rugby Team coached by Larry Gelwix, who used rugby as a tool to help boys become noble young men with strong, traditional values centered around the simple rule of never doing anything to bring shame upon oneself, one's team or one's family.
