SAVE DOLLARS ON YOUR TAXES WITH A QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a distribution made directly by the trustee of your individual retirement account (IRA), other than SEP of SIMPLE IRA, to an organization eligible to receive tax-deduction contributions.

- You must be at least age 70 1/2 when the distribution is made.
- You must have the same type of acknowledgment of your contribution that you would need to claim a deduction for a charitable contribution.
- The maximum annual exclusion for QCDs is \$100,000. If you file a joint return, your spouse also can have a QCD and exclude up to \$100,000.
- A QCD will count towards your required minimum distribution.
- If all the requirements are met, a QCD is nontaxable, but you can't claim a charitable contribution deduction for a QCD.

The donations can be annually or monthly and for the Budget or a Designated Account.
