His mother, Nancy Hanks Lincoln, died when he was just a boy, but she had a profound influence on his life.

Many of us can say the same thing. My own mother, Katherine Stubblefield, enrolled me in the Cradle Roll at First Baptist Church, Fayetteville, Arkansas and saw that I was in church throughout my childhood. She taught me how to pray and helped me memorize Scriptures that have stayed with me for life.

On June 11, 1963, now sixty years ago, I surrendered to the call to ministry at Ridgecrest Baptist Assembly in North Carolina. After the service that Tuesday night, I made my way to a telephone booth and called my parents. When my mother answered, I blurted out the details of the decision I had just made. I heard her crying softly and wondered what her tears meant. She then told me something I had never heard before. She said there was some question when I was in her womb whether I would make it to child birth. During that period, she committed my life to the Lord. In retrospect, I can see God's hand at work over the course of my life.

Memorial Day

The other special Sunday, May 28, is part of Memorial Day Weekend. In worship we will have a threefold emphasis. First, we will remember those who have given their lives in service to our country. Second, we will call the names of those in our church family who have gone to be with the Lord since last Memorial Day. A list of names is on page 6 of the Banner. A flower for each person will become part of an arrangement. Third, we will observe the Lord's Supper, a memorial to our Lord who gave his life for us, so that we may experience eternal life with him. I hope you will plan to be present.

On March 30 Amy McNeely informed about 35 attendees at the "Helping Elders Avoid Financial Exploitation" seminar of the dangers and pitfalls to which anyone can fall victim.

She warned about devices being inserted in gas pumps that can copy your card number. She said if the card is loose when you insert it beware!

Also, be cautious about email or text messages that say suspicious activity on your account has been noticed or claim there's a problem with your payment information.

If a screen pops up on your computer—maybe from a reputable company like Microsoft—that says your computer is infected with a virus and to call a number and it can be fixed before you lose all of your data, don't believe them! Don't give access to your computer! Immediately, exit the internet, wait a few minutes and restart your computer.

Another common ruse is an email that purports to be from a friend or family member who needs your assistance. Verify with that person before sending any money or gift cards.

An informative question and answer session and refreshments followed Amy's presentation.
