"For I know the plans I have for you', declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

From my heart to yours:

When God Calls

Have you ever felt your life is in a rut? That every day seems like the day before? The opening verse in Exodus Chapter 3 points

to the routineness of Moses' life. "Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro, his father-inlaw, the priest of Midian." Every day for years, he had given himself to this menial task.

There is no indication in this passage that something extraordinary is about to happen in Moses' life. Rather, it is just another day among many. Moses walked beside his flock trying to keep them together. Sometimes, he had to chase a stray. Now and then, he would stop long enough to shake the sand out of his sandals. At mid-day, he would sit down for a quiet meal. At the end of the day, he would return home with the flock and join the family. Then early to bed and early to rise as another day would begin.

On this particular day, all of a sudden, something remarkable happened. Moses saw a bush burning, but it was not consumed. Out of the bush, he heard God calling his name. From this experience, Moses received his commission to return to Egypt to free God's people from bondage and to lead them to the Promised Land.

What does this burning bush event say about how God speaks to us today? Even more important, how should we respond? When God speaks, it is usually not in lightning bolts or claps of thunder. Second Timothy 1:9 refers to God "who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our own works but according to His own purpose and grace which was given to us in Christ before the world began."

speaks through the ordinary, God often commonplace times in our lives. Gideon was threshing grain when he received God's call (Judges 6). Samuel was serving as a child in the tabernacle (1 Samuel 3). David was caring for his sheep (1 Samuel 17:20). Elisha was plowing a field (1 Kings 19:19-21). Four of the disciples were fishing when Jesus called them to follow Him (Mark 1:16-20). Every person's call is different, but nevertheless real, important, and life-changing. Every Christian is called to meet a need in our world. We are all gifted and expected to serve the Lord. It may be that God places a burden on us or gives us a passion to minister to those around us in a certain way.

In the "Experiencing God" studies, we have learned that God is working all the time, and we need to recognize what He is doing and join Him in His work.

Every time God calls, we have the option to respond in one of four ways. First, we can run ahead before we are sent. Second, we can retreat after we have failed. Third, we can resist the call by making excuses. Moses fell into this trap when he first heard God's call. Fourth, we can choose to remain open, available, and obedient to do His will when His call comes. Which response will you make? The fourth choice is the right one!


