#### **NEW: Lutheran Music and Meaning** by Daniel Zager

Music has meaning. More than a series of notes, more than associated verbal texts, more than personal entertainment—music has meaning. In *Lutheran Music and Meaning*, author Daniel Zager demonstrates how music signals and conveys meaning. With suggested listening examples, chapters discuss the means that the great Lutheran composers used to convey meaning and in what ways liturgy, Church Year, and lectionary provide integrated contexts for meaning. Written specifically for the congregational singer and listener, this book assists the curious in learning more about Lutheran music, its function, and its meaning. *Paperback: \$17*

#### **NEW: A Little Book on Prayer** by Martin Luther, translated by Matthew C. Harrison

Many Christians struggle with prayer even though it's an essential part of the Christian life. "What should I pray for?" they may wonder. "How should I pray?" "What if my mind wanders?" "What if I get stuck praying the same thing every day?" When asked by his barber and good friend Peter Beskendorf for some practical guidance on how to pray, Martin Luther responded by writing this brief treatise, first published in 1535. This edition is a modern translation that brings us Luther's practical instruction, using his ITCP method: 1. Instruction; 2. Thanksgiving; 3. Confession; 4. Prayer. This method anchors prayer in the catechism or other biblical texts, but allows the Holy Spirit to prompt thoughts via the Word, which may be chased more freely by the mind at prayer. Readers will find their prayer lives refreshed and invigorated as they become more comfortable raising supplications to God.

#### **NEW: Extra Nos: Discovering Grace outside Myself** by FLAME

A deeply personal account of one man's faith, *Extra Nos* recounts hip-hop Christian rapper FLAME's journey from Calvinism to Lutheranism. After a serious car accident when he was 16, FLAME dedicated his music to Christian doctrine. Follow his path of being discovered as an artist to attending Concordia Seminary. In *Extra Nos*, FLAME dissects the misguided lyrics he used to write and details the truth he found in Lutheranism. While FLAME's faith journey and life may be unique, readers will recognize the forgiveness, kindness, and healing nature of Lutheranism. Grammy-nominated FLAME has released nine albums since 2004. After three years of studying Lutheran theology at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, FLAME became confessionally Lutheran. In 2020, he was received into the Lutheran Church and proceeded to write his EP *Christ for You* on the sacraments. *Paperback: \$17*
