EPISTLE READING: *Ephesians 4:1-16*

I, a prisoner in the Lord, encourage you to live the kind of life which proves that God has called you. Be humble and gentle in every way. Be patient with each other and lovingly accept each other. Through the peace that ties you together, do your best to maintain the unity that the Spirit gives. There is one body and one Spirit. In the same way you were called to share one hope. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over everything, through everything, and in everything.

God's favorhas been given to each of us. It was measured out to us by Christ who gave it. That's why the Scriptures say:

"When He went to the highest place, He took captive those who had captured us and gave gifts to people."

Now what does it mean that He went up except that He also had gone down to the lowest parts of the earth? The One who had gone down also went up above all the heavens so that He fills everything.

He also gave apostles, prophets, missionaries, as well as pastors and teachers as gifts to His church. Their purpose is to prepare God's people to serve and to build up the body of Christ. This is to continue until all of us are united in our faith and in our knowledge about God's Son, until we become mature, until we measure up to Christ, who is the standard. Then we will no longer be little children, tossed and carried about by all kinds of teachings that change like the wind. We will no longer be influenced by people who use cunning and clever strategies to lead us astray. Instead, as we lovingly speak the truth, we will grow up completely in our relationship to Christ, who is the head. He makes the whole body fit together and unites it through the support of every joint. As each and every part does its job, He makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

HOLY GOSPEL: John 6:22-35

On the next day the people were still on the other side of the sea. They noticed that only one boat was there and that Jesus had not stepped into that boat with His disciples. The disciples had gone away without Him. Other boats from Tiberias arrived near the place where they had eaten the bread after the Lord gave thanks. When the people saw that neither Jesus nor His disciples were there, they got into these boats and went to the city of Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found Him on the other side of the sea, they asked Him, "Rabbi, when did You get here?"

SHARING OF THE PEACE

For those communing, who so desire, the center cups in each tray are <u>alcohol free</u>. The wafers on the stand next to the pillar pulpit side (when kneeling for communion) or on the stand in front of the baptismal font (when processing for communion) are <u>gluten free</u>.

In our 9:30 a.m. service we will practice the Easter tradition of continuous communion. We will not kneel at the altar, rather we will join the procession of saints and come forward and remain standing as we receive the bread and wine. After receiving the elements, you are invited to return to your seat and continue in meditation, prayer and song.
