# Have a Volunteer Read: Romans 3:21-26

### Point #1: God's give us <u>HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS</u>.

"But now... We've been hearing all about sin. Your sin. My sin. Our sin. But now... Paul begins to talk about our only hope. There is a massive shift in Romans here. But it's more than just a shift in Paul's argument. It's a cosmic shift. Something new has happened in the universe. Never before. Never again. But now the righteousness of God has been manifested... Paul is saying that God has intervened. In Jesus, God's righteousness has invaded the world. Paul is saying that the life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus has changed everything. We had no hope, but now God has intervened." – **Michael Nolen** 

### Now that God has intervened in your life, how does that give you hope?

### Have Another Volunteer Read: Psalm 89:14

### Point #2: We receive God's righteousness BY FAITH, NOT WORKS.

"That's why our only hope is to trust, to have faith. We receive salvation, or God's righteousness, by faith in Christ alone. Salvation is by faith in Christ alone. When we say salvation is by faith, it's not a generic faith. It is a faith in a particular person. We're saved by the object of our faith. Faith in Christ Jesus, and faith alone. Now, as James tells us in his book, that faith is never alone. Real faith is always accompanied by fruit. But faith is the root." – **Michael Nolen**

# Have Another Volunteer Read: Ephesians 2:8 Point #3: God's grace <u>JUSTIFIES AND REDEEMS US</u>.

"Justification is not a process, but a pronouncement. It's a legal declaration where God's righteousness is not infused, but imputed to us. In justification, God's righteousness is not infused into us, it is imputed, or credited, to us." – **Michael Nolen** 

Discuss the difference between being infused (process by which righteousness is earned) vs imputed (to be credited, to us) with God's righteousness.

### Have Another Volunteer Read:

# Point #4: Christ's sacrifice PROPITIATES GOD'S WRATH.

<u>"Propitiation means that God poured out on Jesus the righteous anger he had toward us. God's</u> righteous anger toward sin is not a contradiction with his love, but a necessary corollary of it. Think about it. When you love someone, you hate the things that destroy them. If you love the cancer patient, you hate the cancer that destroys them. That's how God feels about our sin: Sin destroys his creation and the glory and righteousness which are the foundation of that universe, and us. So he hates—is angry—at sin. So Jesus stepped in the way to pay for it. By so doing, God demonstrated his righteousness, because in his restraint God passed over the sins previously committed". – Michael Nolen
