August 17 - Orientation to Safety - Required for Hybrid Learners (Aug. 17th) *Hybrid students attend 1 day a week only Monday or Tuesday of their hybrid day All Students Return to School M/W scholars - On Campus T/Th scholars - Check in Online ONLY 100% Remote Scholars - Check in Online ONLY
September 8 - Transition to the 2 - Day Hybrid Schedule With proper protocols in place and favorable updates from the health department, we will transition to the hybrid model of 2 days per week the week of September 8th.
October 2 - Priority Learning Day Transition Once the orientation weeks and the 2-day hybrid schedule are implemented safely, we will offer a Friday, Priority Learning Day for selected scholars.

Additional Safety Measures Offered: Onsite Covid Testing & 100% Remote learning week after each break (Fall, Winter, Spring)

As of June 23, 2022, NCDHHS has sunset the StrongSchools NC Public Health Toolkit. Going forward, school administrators, staff, and families should now refer to the CDC's Operational Guidance for K12 Schools for information on how to lower risk of COVID-19 in school settings. As we transition from the StrongSchools Toolkit to the CDC guidance, highlights of policies for schools include:

- It is no longer recommended that schools require staff to report their vaccination status and participate in a screening program, if they are unvaccinated
- Masks are recommended at high CDC COVID-19 community levels and also in some other specific situations, including for individuals following exposure or after completing isolation
- It is no longer recommended that schools implement physically distancing strategies (such as keeping students 3ft or 6ft apart)
- Universal contact tracing is not recommended in K12 settings
- Testing, Ventilation and Cleaning remain important layers of protection
