### PASTOR'S + CORNER

Minister's forums and in-person conversations are consumed with one specific topic these days: church decline. Some people are anxious: "Churches are closing! We're losing numbers!" Some are confident: 'The Spirit is doing a new thing!" Some are weary or annoyed "I tried to warn people that this was happening, but nobody would listen!" Most days, I'm curious. It's true that the church is changing, and in big ways. People who have attended church, faithfully, for decades have opted out citing one excuse or the other. People who came occasionally now come once a year, if at all. Some people call the remaining folks the "faithful remnant." To be clear, I'm not talking about Elmhurst Presbyterian Church, specifically, but mainline protestant churches, generally. Many scholars of religion and society have written more eloquently than I have or can about the statistics, the reasons, and the future. My calling is to continue to listen to the voice of the Spirit and the direction of the Session and to follow wherever both might lead.

I've been reticent to read too many books that prescribe a solution. Too many books offer five-part plans and six easy steps to take. Filled with acronyms that help you chart a new course or cast a new vision, I find most books on church leadership to be vapid and hollow. One exception to this is the book I'm reading right now called When Church Stops Working by Dr. Andrew Root. Andy was a Ph.D. student at Princeton Seminary when I was in the Master of Divinity program, and he was one of my preceptors. Even then, he was an outside-of-the-box thinker who looked beyond simple solutions. It was only because of this relationship that I even picked up the book. I'm only about halfway through, so hopefully my glowing endorsement isn't premature. I don't think it is, though, because even if the second half provides little or no instruction or insight (I doubt that's true), I've gotten so much from the first half, I almost feel like I can stop reading.

The book is about waiting on God. It's about chucking the five-point plans and most church leadership books to the curb (yes, please.) Consider this:

If we are to take our own origin story seriously, we need to see that God's people only ever act in response to God's act. They do not plan their own activity and then proceed. They encounter God and act in obedience to that encounter. God acts through God's people, not in the way a puppet master manipulates a marionette but in the manner of a relationship that starts with God's action. (p.24)

This line keeps ringing in my ears: they do not plan their own activity and then proceed. We act in response to what God is doing. This is the way the community of faith has always operated. Root is arguing that if we're not sure where to go next, the faithful and proper response is to wait for God to show us. To listen. To slow down.

This is true at an individual as well as organizational level. What does it mean to wait for God? What does it mean to respond to God? These are the questions I'm pondering as we move into another program year.




### Leadership Sunday







In the Summer Edition of the Elmhurst Presbyterian Church Newsletter, Pastor Traci presented a **Focus on Why**. This segment highlighted our call to being a Matthew 25 church.

You will recall in Matthew 25: 31-46, Jesus makes clear that what we do matters to God and how we treat others is important to God.



Pastor Traci reminded us that "Whys" give us direction, vision, and focus. In Malawi, infants, children, and their families are experiencing devastating illness and physical maladies that in our country, would be minor. Much of the health disparity is because existing medical equipment and supplies in most Malawian healthcare facilities is original to the buildings built in the early 1900's.

So...WHAT can we do to serve the least of those among us? Earlier this year, our Session pledged \$15,000 to help transport a cargo container of over \$300,000 in donated medical equipment to Malawi, Africa.

Our pledge of \$15,000 is WHAT we can do!

**HOW** will we make this vision a reality? HOW will we raise \$15,000 and touch the lives of the people of Malawi?

Our HOW: Elmhurst Presbyterian Church's Fundraising Gala on September 22nd, 2023.
