What is Faithfulness?

Absolute Honesty (Proverbs 12:22; 11:1)

"The Lord detests lying lips, but he delights in men who are truthful." and "The Lord abhors dishonest scales, but accurate weights are his delight."

Lying has been defined as "any deceit in word, act, attitude - or

silence; in deliberate exaggerations, in distortions of the truth,

or in creating false impressions."



Utter Dependability

In Psalm 15 David asks the question, Lord, who may dwell in your

sanctuary?"..... he "who keeps his oath even when it hurts."

Unswerving Loyalty

Proverbs 17:17 ... "A friend that loves at all times, and is born [that is

becomes] a brother in adversity."

🚸 🚸 There is no such person as a "fair-weather friend" 🚸 🚸

Rooting out the Artificial Fruit and the Weeds

Unfaithfulness or Infidelity is Undependability

The Unfaithful has no Definite Direction, no solid supports to provide any predictability of conduct.

Unfaithfulness is very close to Disobedience

The man who is not controlled by God has no settled reason to keep his word or to discharge his obligations.

Proverbs 12:22 – "Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord; but they that deal truly are his delight."



"The lie has no feet on which it can stand."

Gentleness

Key Verse: Acts 11: 24

"He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord."

Worm: Self-Seeking

Artificial Fruit: False Modesty

Gentleness = Active trait which describes the manner in which we should treat others

Pseudo-gentleness is timidity

versus

Meekness = Passive trait which describes the proper Christian response when being mistreated

Pseudo-meekness is cowardly

Gentleness is not the opposite of courage; it takes

courage to be meek and gentle in an evil world.

God's Strength is Essential to be Truly Gentle Isaiah 40:11 "He tends his flock like a shepherd: he gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those that have young." Matthew 11: 28-30 "Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for lam

gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

Qualities of Gentleness.....

Treating Others Gently

Actively seek to make others feel at ease or "restful"

Demonstrate gentleness for the personal dignity of others

Avoid blunt speech and an abrupt manner; seek to answer everyone with sensitivity and ready

Don't feel threatened by opposition or resent those who oppose you

Don't degrade or belittle or gossip about a brother or sister who has fallen into sin

Qualities of Gentleness.....

Treating Others Considerately

Follow the principle of "What is best for this person?"

Philippians 4:5 says "Let your gentleness be evident

to all. The Lord is near."

Seeking a Gentle Spirit

- Decide that this trait is really important
- Ask those you know best and will be honest to evaluate you

Rooting out the Artificial Fruit and the Weeds

IMPATIENC

Luke 9:46-56 is a great illustration of Self-Serving

Jesus' disciples asked "Which of us is the greatest?"

Verse 48 - Jesus answered ".... for he who is least among you all is the one who is great."

Later in these verses we see Jesus making plans to spend the night in a Samaritan village...but the Samaritans didn't want Jews in their village... so the ugly weed raised its head when James and John said to Jesus.....

"Do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and destroy them?"

Rooting out the Artificial Fruit and the Weeds

Jesus rebuked them for they failed to see their

place in redemptive history

The disciples self-centeredness had begotten

vengeance...they had forgotten the meaning

of "the Gospel," the good news.

The time of fire will come, and when it is called

down it will be sent down in righteousness,

not selfishness.

Worm: Lack of Control

Artificial Fruit: Choosing lesser Goods

Some Definitions of Self-Control

"The ability to avoid excesses, to stay within reasonable bounds"

"The healthful regulation of our desires and appetites, preventing their excess"

NIV uses two different words from the original language:

"moderation or temperance in the gratification of our desires and appetites"

"soundness of mind or sound judgment...sober or sensible"

Summary Definition:

"Self-control is the exercise of inner strength under the direction of sound judgment that enables us to do, think, and say things that are pleasing to God"

Honor God with Your Body

Timothy 6:17 – "God...richly provides us with everything

for our enjoyment"

.... But man in his sin has corrupted all the natural blessings

Self-control of the body should be aimed primarily at three areas of physical temptation:

gluttony laziness sexual immorality or impurity

thoughts looks suggestive speech

Take Captive Every Thought

Il Corinthians 10:5 – "We take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ"

Philippians 4:8 –

"Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable
– if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things."

Proverbs 4:23 – "Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life."

The gates to our thought lives are primarily our eyes and our ears

Solomon said to guard; Paul said to flee

Curbing Your Emotions

Solomon said in Proverbs 16:32 – Better a patient man than a warrior, a man who controls his temper than one who takes a city" The taking of a city is child's play, compared with this wrestling ...That is only the battle of a day. Thus the weary, unceasing conflict of life

An uncontrolled temper is a contradiction in the life of a person who is seeking to practice godliness

Break the Chains of Self-Indulgence

Paul in Romans 12:3 says – "Think of yourself with sober judgment" and Proverbs 27:12 says "The prudent see danger and take refuge."

Spiritual prudence requires that we know ourselves – our weaknesses. Only as we study the Scriptures and ourselves will we be able to exercise sound judgment

True spiritual self-discipline holds believers in bounds but never in bonds; its effect is to enlarge, expand and lberate

James 1:25 describes the Word of God as "the perfect law that gives freedom"

Rooting out the Artificial Fruit and the Weeds

The weed of lack of self-control seems to be a habit of choosing continually something bad or harmful rather than something good; or a continual choosing of a lesser good in preference to something more important

1 Corinthians 6 – Paul tells us that since the body is now the sanctuary of the Holy Spirit, to injure the body is an affront to Him.

I Corinthians 6:19 – You are not your own. You are bought with a price



"Nothing in my hand I bring, Simply to Thy cross I cling"

God's love, when we think of it, will bring us to joy, peace,

and patience

The Image of God

If we look on others, not because of what they are in themselves, but because of whose image they bear, they will provoke us to kindness, goodness and faithfulness

The Sovereignty of God

Whenever the Lord interposes to prevent the evil of those who desire to injure us, and not that only, but turns even their wicked designs to our good; he subdues by this method, our carnal affections, and renders us more just and placable.



Treating Others as We Would Jesus

The call to obey the Great Commission is not based on the

attractiveness of people as they now are, but on the anticipated

attractiveness when they are renewed by the Spirit of God



The Fruit and Ourselves

Propensity to Sin

The sweet singer of Israel, the man after God's own heart was guilty of adultery,

murder, deceit and judicial rashness. This is a revelation not only of David's

propensity to sin...but also of ours.

Accepting Ourselves

Meekness is accepting ourselves as we really are; Self-control entails the choice

of the best of all goals, God's glory, and the power to make progress towards it.



The Fruit and Ourselves

Temples of God

The New Testament teaches that gentleness and self-control thrive in an

atmosphere of self-love when we realize the great value which it attaches to our

bodies as the temples of God

Self-Control is Freedom

"And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

Some Summary Thoughts on How God Acts

My Soul needs to have an *inclination* to God and his Word. Without that, nothing else will happen of any value in my life. I must want to know God, read his Word and draw near to him. (Psalm 119:36)

Next, I need to have the eyes of my heart opened so that my inclination leads me to the Word so that I can know the truth, not just my own ideas. (Psalm 119:18)

Next, I need my heart to be enlightened with these wonders." I need to perceive glory in them and not just interesting facts. (Eph. 1:18)

Some Summary Thoughts on How God Acts (cont.)

Next, it is essential that I long for my heart to be united for God, because I am concerned that my heart is not pure and is fragmented with parts still in darkness. (Psalm 86:11)

Next, what I want from all this engagement with the Word of God and the work of his Spirit is that my heart will be satisfied with God and not with the world. (Psalm 90:14)

But I don't want my satisfaction and joy to be fragile or weak, but to be strong in the face of adversities. I want to be strong in joy. (Eph. 3:16)

Some Summary Thoughts on How God Acts (cont.)

Furthermore, I do not want my strength in Christ to simply be fruitful for me, but for others.

Acts 20:35 clearly teaches that it is more blessed to give than to receive.

So I want to produce good deeds and works of love for others, so that the glory of God will be seen in my life, and others will taste and see that the Lord is good (Colossians 1.10)

Finally, my constant prayer should remain

"hallowed be Thy name." (Matt. 6:9)

Mind + Heart/Will = Soul
