Knowing God: His Existence

Existence of God: Believing the Evidences of Scripture and Nature

Genesis 1:1

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth."

Psalms 19: 1-2

"The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge."

Romans 1:20

"For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities – his eternal power and divine nature – have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse."

Existence of God : Humanity's Inner Awareness of God

All persons have an awareness of God : Romans 1:19, 21, 25 Romans 1:19: "since what may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them"

Some persons will deny God's existence: Ps 10:3-4; Ps. 14:1 Psalm 10: 3-4: "He ['the wicked man' v.2] boasts of the cravings of his heart; he blesses the greedy and reviles the Lord. In his pride the wicked does not seek him; in all his thoughts there is no room for God."

Some persons will willfully sin in denial: Rom. 1:18, 20, 23-32 Romans 1:18 "The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of men who suppress the truth by their wickedness."









Romans 8:15-16

"For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship, and by him we cry, *Abba, Father*. The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children."

Ephesians 3:16-18

"I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through the Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. "Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy.." Existence of God: Only God can overcome our sin and point us toward Himself

l Corinthians 1:21

"For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe."

Il Corinthians 4:4

"The god of this age had blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God

Cosmological Argument:

Considers the fact that every known thing in the universe has a cause. Therefore, it reasons, the universe itself must also have a cause, and the cause of such a great universe can only be God.

Teleological Argument: [explanation of the purpose phenomena serve, rather than of the cause]

Argument is a subset of the cosmological argument and focuses on the evidence of harmony, order, and design in the universe, and argues that its design gives evidence of an intelligent purpose, thus there must be an intelligent and purposeful God who created it to function this way.

Ontological Argument:

Argument begins with the idea of God, who is defined as a **being** 'greater than which nothing can be imagined.' It argues that the characteristic of existence must belong to such as the **nature of being** [metaphysics], since it is greater than not to exist. *

Moral Argument

Argument begins from man's sense of right and wrong, and of the need for justice to be done, and argues that there must be a God who is the source of right and wrong and who will someday mete out justice to all people.

* the examination of the fundamental nature of reality, such as the relationship between mind and matter, between substance and attribute, between potentiality and actuality

Some Questions to Consider

Do you believe most people today believe in the existence of God?

Look at your hand. Is it more or less complex than a wristwatch? Is it logical to think that either one of them came about by an accidental combination of elements?

Foundational Truths About Knowing God

God has spoken to man, and the Bible is His Word given to us to make us wise unto salvation

God is Lord and King over His world; He rules all things for His own glory, displaying His perfections in all that He does, in order that men and angels may worship and adore Him



God is Savior, active in sovereign love through the Lord Jesus Christ to rescue believers from the guilt and power of sin, to adopt them as His sons and daughters, so to bless them accordingly God is Triune; there are within the Godhead three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; and the work of salvation is one in which all three act together. Holiness or Godliness means responding to God's revelation in trust and obedience, faith and worship, prayer and praise, submission and service. Life must be seen and lived in the light of God's Word. This, and nothing else, is true religion.

".....without holiness no one will see the Lord." Hebrews 12:14 What effect does knowing God have on Mankind?

Knowing God: His Knowability



Knowability of God: Necessity for God to reveal Himself to Us

"All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him."

Knowability of God: We can never fully understand God

Knowability of God: Also..can't understand any single thing

Functionality of the Trinity: Redemption



Using John 3:16, Gal. 4:4, Eph. 1:9-10, John 6:38, Heb. 10:5-7, and John 14:26 complete the sequence for the work of Redemption

God the Father planned redemption and sent his Son into the world (John 3:16, Gal. 4:4)

The Son obeyed the Father and accomplished Redemption for us (John 6:38, Heb.10:5-7)

After the Son ascended to heaven, the Father and Son sent the Holy Spirit to apply redemption to us (John 14:26, 16:7)

A Triune Approach

First and Foremost Steps

Believers in Christ MUST be in ACTIVE Communion with God

This is a dynamic interactive relationship

Triune God **Herrice Private** Believer United to Christ in God by the Holy Spirit

<u>Communion</u> with the Triune

Believers united to Christ Jesus are called to respond to God's unilateral action of *union* through a desired interaction between the Holy Spirit and God

 <u>Communion</u> with God can waver (up/down) and lead to greater sanctification or "run away sin, with a diminished conscience or a loss of <u>communion</u> with God

 Prayer, corporate worship, biblical meditation are means to foster <u>communion</u> with God and thus lead into a greater fellowship

Comforting activity with the Triune

Believers should not be passive in the hope that the Spirit will bring comfort, rather they should....

- seek His comfort by focusing on the promises of God realized in the Spirit
- call out to the Spirit for supplication to bring consolation, and
- attend "to his motions" which take us to the Father and Son.

Testing the Spirits activity through the Triune

- \heartsuit
- The Spirit is the Spirit of Freedom
- this is when God's Spirit brings spiritual freedom, love, and rest. This is freedom for obedience, not freedom from it.
- •

The Spirit of God *tends to work in and through natural human faculties* (i.e. mind, will, affections and body)



The Spirit is the Spirit of Prayer. The soul is never more raised with the love of God than when the Spirit is taken into intimate communion with him in prayer

Union with the Triune



Humans are merely receptive, being the object of God's gracious action

- this action is *unilateral* action by God as the Holy Spirit ignites the dead in Christ for regeneration

 this act is by the object of God's radical and free grace that does not ebb and flow

Knowing God: His Attributes Study Overview of God's Character



Incommunicable : Those attributes <u>not</u> shared with others i.e. eternity, unchangeableness, omnipresence

Communicable: Those attributes God shares with us i.e. love, knowledge, mercy, justice

Attribute <u>least</u> reflected in our character: Independence SELF-EXISTENT Psalm 102:26-27 "....the Father has life in himself"

SELF-SUFFICIENT Revelation 4:8 "....nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything."

SELF-DIRECTED Acts 17:25 "Who has prescribed for him his way?"

ETERNAL John 5:26 "Who was and is and is to come!"

CONSISTENT Job 36:22-23 "You will remain.....you are the same, and your years have no end."

God's Incommunicable Attributes: Independence

Definition:

God does not need us or the rest of creation for anything,

yet we and the rest of creation can glorify him and bring him joy.



God's Incommunicable Attributes: Independence (cont)

God doesn't need mankind......

Acts 17:24-25 – "The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by hands. And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything, because he himself gives all men life and breath and everything else."

but fellowship with God is evident.....

John 17:24 – "Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, and to see my glory, the glory you have given me because you loved me before the creation of the world." God's Incommunicable Attributes: Independence (cont)

God's exists by virtue of his very nature – He was never created and never came into being.

God always was! God has no origin! Origin is a creature word.

Revelation 4:11

"You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being."

John 1:3 "Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made." God's Incommunicable Attributes: Independence (cont)

God's independence is seen in His self-designation......

Exodus 3:14 - "God said to Moses, 'I AM WHO I AM'"

God is transcendant:

- God never thinks about the size of anything. Why?
- God never thinks about **distance**. Why?
- God's uncreated quality causes him to be transcendant

God's Incommunicable Attributes: Unchangeableness

Definition:

God is unchanging in his being, perfections, purposes, and

promises, yet God does act and feel emotions, and he acts and

feels differently in response to different situations.

God's Incommunicable Attributes: Eternity

Definition:

God has no beginning, end, or succession of moments in

his own being, and he sees all time equally vividly, yet God

sees events in time and acts in time.



Definition:

God does not have size or spatial dimensions and is present

at every point of space with his whole being, yet God acts

differently in different places



Definition

God is not divided into parts, yet we see different attributes

of God emphasized at different times



God's Communicable Attributes: Spirituality

Definition

God is spirit and true worship does not require that one

be present in any specific physical location, as true worship is

located in one's inner spiritual condition.
