Pastor's Corner for January 29-February 4

Abundant Life (John 10:10)

On February 2 Juli and I join the Life for Uganda team (Cheryl and Jeff Fike, Ron Bostick, Bruce Brodhagen and Debra Werner) for a trip to Uganda. The purpose of this trip is to reconnect with our partners in mission on the other side of the world, celebrate our support for a new church in Amudat town, and take part in a graduation celebration at the LCU seminary graduates. At every service this weekend, you can find out more about all that the team will be doing as we gather together at RLC for a special focus on God's mission to the world. One of our mission focuses at Resurrection Lutheran Church is to "engage the

nations," whether we do that on an international or national mission trip or get to know and share God's love with the people from the many nations God is bringing to our own doorstep right here in the Research Triangle. # Habitat for Humanity

The Lutheran Build Coalition with Habitat is back for 2023 beginning with the warehouse wall build on **Saturday, February 11**. Site construction will continue through the end of May. The Lutheran churches in the area will join together to build a new Habitat home. Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities, and hope.

This year, the Coalition homes are being built in a new community called Old Poole Place in Southeast Raleigh. On the exciting Day 1, February 11, each Lutheran church is sending 3-5 volunteers to help build the walls and then raise them onto the foundation at the build site.

We have selected 2 RLC sponsored work days (Saturdays) and we need 15 volunteers each day to support the build. Our work days are **March 25** and **May 13**. No construction experience is necessary, being a member of RLC isn't necessary, feel free to invite a friend; there will be jobs for everyone with a serving heart.

Not able to join an RLC build day? No worries. You can sign up for Saturdays that other churches couldn't fill or even weekday (Thursday/Friday) slots, if that works better.

# Sanctity of Life

This past Sunday marked the 39th observance of Sanctity of Human Life Sunday, a day where pro-life citizens and churches across America came together and lamented the tragedy of abortion. This observance came about when President Ronald Reagan issued "Proclamation 5147 – National Sanctity of Human Life Day, 1984, which highlighted the lives that had already been lost to abortion and designated Sunday, January 22, 1984 as National Sanctity of Human Life Day. He stated, "I call upon the citizens of this blessed land to gather on that day in homes and places of worship to give thanks for the gift of life, and to reaffirm our commitment to the dignity of every human being and the sanctity of each human life." This tradition was continued by Presidents George H. W. Bush, George W. Bush, and Donald Trump.

Here are some numbers to think about:

- 63 million The estimated number of abortions in America between 1973 and 2020.
- 129 million The estimated number of people who identify as pro-life.
- 2 million The number of people served by pro-life pregnancy centers in 2019.

Did you know that currently the abortion pill accounts for more than 60% of all US abortions. Women can now order the abortion pill online, receive it by mail, and abort their babies at home without ever seeing a medical professional or having an ultrasound to see how far along they are. To effectively reach these women in 2023, Gateway is looking to add Telecare services. This will allow them to have a virtual appointment with women seeking the abortion pill online and schedule a same-day ultrasound before it is too late.

Statistics show that 85% of women, who complete a Telecare appointment, go on to schedule an ultrasound, and 40% of abortion-determined women choose LIFE after an ultrasound.

NOTE: If you are returning a bottle, place it in the box with a hole in its cover. Also remember, if you are paying by check, the check should be payable to Gateway Women's Care. If you have not already picked up a bottle, please take one on your way out of church. If you have already filled one bottle, feel free to take another.

Above all keep the unborn and their parents in your prayers.




# Mark Parsons Vice President Truth in Love Ministry
