# Forty Days Of "Receiving" Has Begun (Matthew 4:1-11)

The season of Lent has begun. Lent is a period of 40 days (46 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter, minus the Sundays) that calls to our minds the 40 days of Jesus' being tempted in the wilderness (Matt 4:1-11), a text traditionally associated with the beginning of Lent. The custom of fasting or self-denial among Christians is associated with Jesus' own time of fasting prior to his temptation. Today we hear the occasional "breaking in" of ancient Lenten observances with phrases like, "I'm giving up chocolate for Lent." Such practices can be beneficial. Martin Luther himself observed that the practice of giving up stuff could be "fine outward"

training." But if the practice begins— and ends— with a focus on what we give up, something is obviously missing. Why not start Lent not only with a focus on what you are giving up, but on what you are RECEIVING? Why not take part in an observance of Lent that allows you to carve out a quiet place each day so that God can fill you up again with awe and joy and humility? In keeping the silence of Lent, in turning down the volume of the world and in slowing down the pace of a frantic schedule, you are not just giving something up. You are adding margin to your life. You are allowing God the opportunity to create greater relational, emotional, and spiritual wholeness in you. This year let's not just give something up for Lent. Let's "get" Jesus... the Lord of the cross... for Lent. I invite you to keep the silence of Lent with the new Lenten devotional "Amazing Grace" which you can pick up at church the next time we see you there. You can also set aside time for quiet by joining us at our Wednesday evening Lenten services, where you will experience brief meditations on the hymn "Amazing Grace" on this 250th anniversary year of the hymn. Of course you can always meditate on the suffering and death of Jesus in your alone time... wherever and whenever you make that happen. Whatever you do, know that Jesus, the One tested in the wilderness, crucified and risen again, is with you. Don't just give something up... receive. Receive all that Jesus brings you during Lent again this year!




You will want to bring your Bibles to each class. Copies of the poems will be distributed at each session. Led by Larry Cameron.


