Pastor's Corner for March 5-11

No Resume Required (Gen. 12:1-9; John 3:16)

Even back in the old days when job applications were submitted in person with a face-to-face interview, putting oneself forward for a job was never easy. Today, now that applicants must polish resumes and submit them electronically to potential employers without the benefit of the in-person interview, the stakes are even higher. Personal references must be carefully considered. Past job history must be presented that highlights the applicant's achievements and successes. And everyone knows that the resume is only a first step. Any organization serious about taking on a new hire will scour the internet for information that might raise the

#### proverbial red flag.

So, we might be forgiven if we assume that when God took the important first step of building a nation through whom all the world would be blessed, there would have been a more rigorous interview process in place. Or assuming that God didn't need all that (God being God and all), we might think a more auspicious candidate for patriarch might have been appropriate. Instead, God chose Abram. Abram, former idol-worshipper (Joshua 24:2)... Abram, senior citizen (Gen 12:4)... Abram and wife Sarai, childless due to advanced years and sterility (Gen 11:29). Hardly the sorts you would expect to birth a new nation! But that's the point. No resume was required. In fact, there might have been more than one reason why God "shouldn't" have chosen Abram and Sarai... yet choose them He did. The result? Their successes and their calling to faithfulness ultimately did not rest in themselves. It was all God's doing. Read the summary of "Abraham's" life (his name had changed from "Abram" [exalted father] to "Abraham" [father of a multitude] in Joshua. The subject of the story is not Abraham at all— but God ("I took your father Abraham... and led him through all the land of Canaan... I gave him Isaac," etc.)

I mention all of this because, journeying through Lent, it is easy to put the cart before the horse and think that Abraham's /our performance is what's at stake. It isn't. Like Abraham we receive the promise that life begins with GOD... and results in GOD's blessing for all the world (Gen 12:3; John 3:16). That's not to say that God can't or doesn't accomplish great things with us. God might indeed use us to accomplish some amazing, neat stuff along the way. But it is by faith in God's promise, not by performing good works, that we live out our calling as God's people. We are freed from the need to produce the perfect resume. We've already got the job. We therefore live— and allow others to live— not as people with something to prove, but as people who have been proven capable, for Christ's sake.

#### Pulse of the Church Survey Answers Available to View

As announced last week, the results of the "Pulse of the Church" survey are ready to view. I invite you to take a look at the final results <u>by clicking on this link and</u> <u>logging into your account with Resurrection Church Builder</u>. (Go to Groups, select Entire Church Group, under Files, click 2023 Survey Results.) Here are a few takeaways from the survey I noted: Of the 192 people who took the survey....

- Those saying they attend the 9:30 AM Sunday currently make up the largest grouping of RLC in-person worshippers, by worship time (32%);
- Most are currently either Baby Boomers (44%) or Generation X (31%);
- A sizeable number worry "very often" about being able to meet normal monthly living expenses (10%, the third highest ranking of responses);
- 82% agreed strongly that the Bible is true and, as such, "impacts how I live my life";
- 66% said they were "currently leading in some way" at RLC;
- 95% said they were either currently tithing (giving 10% of finances), were working toward giving a tithe, or were giving as they were able to RLC;
- 45% said they were retired;
- Identified the following topics as possible growth areas for RLC:
  - \* "I feel fully equipped to share my faith with people who do not attend church" (only 14% agreed strongly)

\* "The church has helped me embrace my calling in life" (only 20% agreed strongly)

\* "This church helps me develop relationships that encourage accountability" (only 16% agreed strongly)


The RLC Church Council and RLC staff will be discussing these outcomes and considering possible updates in programming that we feel will better enable us to



You will want to bring your Bibles to each class. Copies of the poems will be distributed at each session. Led by Larry Cameron.






## Weekly Bible Study Opportunities


