Amazing Grace, How Sweet the Sound

(John 1:16-17)

It's a cruel irony that Girl Scout cookie sales and March Madness always seem to coincide with the season of Lent. Just when I've convinced myself I'm a person of modest self-discipline, it all goes out the window. There's no resisting a small box (do they get smaller every year?) of Thin Mints or Do-Si-Dos. And no matter how much or how little I have time to tune in to the NCAA basketball tournament each year, watching the Final Four is a tradition that supersedes most everything else on the calendar. Lent is supposed to be a season for discipline. Lent is supposed to be all about self-control. But there seems to be this strange arithmetic resulting in the equation that the more I try to stay focused and disciplined, the more temptations I encounter. C. S. Lewis once said that most people associate temptation with the desires of the flesh (appetites like lust and greed) when in truth the most deadly temptations have to do with attitudes of the heart: pride, fear, and despair. There are distractions and temptations aplenty. Cookies and too much television are the least



of our concerns! But Jesus' time of trial in the wilderness, Jesus' miraculous signs and His conversations with people in need of a Savior repeatedly point the way to His cross... the place where He took away the sins of the world. Through Jesus, God tests our faith in times of trial... making it

STRONGER. The obedient Son of God, our shield and Defender, stood up to temptation in a way that we do not. In Christ, our time of trial is no longer just an exercise of self-discipline in the face of the demonic effort to tempt and to frustrate faith. In Christ, trials bring the

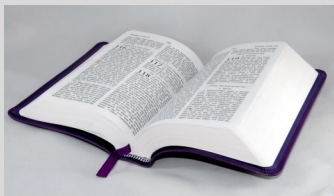
### Poetry and Our Christian Faith

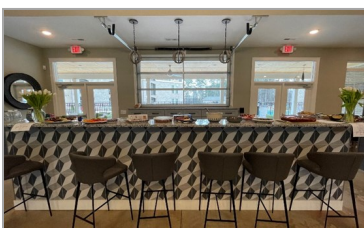

## RLC Church Council News

### February 2023

Your 2023 Church Council met for the second time with its new officers on 14 February 2023. The Council agreed to re-start these monthly updates to the Congregation.

- Pastor Blanke provided a report prior to leaving for Uganda. In this report, he summarized the status of the staff goals and his personal goals for the coming year. All are centered around strategic plan presented to the congregation at the December Voter's Assembly.
- The Treasurer, Mike Hahne, reported on the financials and provided a review of the Endowments. Bottom line, RLC financials are on track.
- The Council was updated on the Principal Call, basically the same information was provided to the Congregation on 11 and 12 February and in the weekly announcements.
- The DCE call was also discussed; the DCE Call Committee is working on finalizing their work with three of an original five candidates. It appears two of the remaining three are not accepting calls at this time, so that leaves the committee with one candidate. The Council is waiting for the committee's recommendation on how to proceed.
- We started the Budgeting process for next year which will go to the Voters in June 2023.
- We are reviewing the RLC Governance Document (an annual requirement for the Council).
- We voted to select Barry Needle and Pastor Blanke as designated voters and nominators in preparation for the 68<sup>th</sup> Regular LCMS Convention.
- The Resurrection Lutheran School (RLS) Student Scholarship Funding is a commitment Resurrection Lutheran Church (RLC) has historically made to RLS children of Called Workers at RLC. The tuition for these students is split evenly between RLS and RLC. Between 2008 and 2018, RLC provided \$127,937 in such scholarships. There were no students in this category until this year, so the Council agreed to provide the required funding for the 2022-2023 school year (\$8800) from unused funds within the current approved budget. Future budgets will have a line item to cover these scholarships.
- The Council began the discussion of how best to distribute the remaining mission funds from the Next 40 Campaign (currently a little over \$110,000). To start things off, we are sending \$1000 to Lutheran World Relief – Turkey Disaster and \$1000 to LCMS Short Term Missions, which supports LCMS workers that travel abroad for outreach mission activities. The Council is open to suggestions for other mission areas that could use our financial support.

In Naborokokya, they showed us around their church and school, and shared their needs with us. Then we enjoyed dinner together. We gifted school supplies and soccer ball, and gave the moms and kids toothbrush and toothpaste sets. It was a great day!

On the way to Lopodot, we ran into some camels. In the village, we taught the children to make origami hearts, played some games, shared dinner together, then showed The Jesus Film.



Today we visited Ryantum and spent the afternoon with many from the congregation and community. We sat under the shade of a beautiful tree, listened to their needs, and shared encouragement and prayers together. We did a craft with the ladies and gifted the children an indestructible soccer ball - both were a big hit!



We give praise and thanksgiving for all the lives they have touched, as they traveled around Amudat. We ask the Lord's blessing on all the seeds of faith that have been planted through the fellowship, activities, sharing the "Jesus Film," and meals prepared and eaten together with the people of the villages that were visited.
