Pastor's Corner for March 19-25

Bend in the Road...Light on the Path (Isaiah 42:14-21; Ephesians 5:8-14)

I remember my first experience with a Christian labyrinth. As I first viewed the maze-like pattern on the floor in front of me, I thought it must be some sort of accommodation to a non-Christian Eastern religion. I'd never seen a maze like this inside a church! What I discovered was that "walking the labyrinth" has a storied history going back many centuries in the Christian faith. And I found that praying or meditating on a single passage of Scripture while walking the labyrinth rewarded me with an experience resembling Truth. Though it first created a sense of frustration as I discovered the road did not extend directly to its goal— but twisted and turned in every direction EXCEPT straight ahead— that frustration slowly gave way to relief as the end of my prayer coincided with the destination of the maze. The experience reminded me of how the unexpected in life is often confounding

and seems to lead us away from our life goals... but God gives us the eyes of faith to persevere and to trust in His plan— to the end.

This weekend, we consider three passages of Scripture with something to say about blindness and seeing. The people of God, called to "open the eyes of the blind," live at times as if they themselves have become blind (Isa 42:19)! Yet because of God's FAITHFUL servant Jesus, we are led to repentance and a new kind of seeing... through the eyes of faith. "At one time you were in darkness," St. Paul writes, "but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light... and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord" (Eph 5:8-10). "Walking in the light" entails being guided by God's priorities and being empowered by God's grace to live in ways that will at times be counter cultural, moving forward by faith despite the twists in the road because we walk not by our own light but by God's light on our path. Together with the man in our Gospel reading we can say, because of Christ: "I was blind... but now I see!" (John 9:25)

This weekend we continue to pray that we might walk in the light of Jesus throughout this Lenten season. The path forward in life might not always go according to plan. The healing work of Christ, the gift of God's love made real for each of us on Calvary's cross, makes every faith journey possible!



I want to offer some special thanks to people who helped bring this about. First of all, we thank our pastors for all their support. We thank Bob Unger and his staff and faculty at Resurrection Lutheran School for deciding to take part even though they had just concluded a major fundraiser for the Ukrainian family. Can't forget Garret Nigg for all his support on the logistics of the campaign and Susan Moore for her editorial support. I also want to include John and Virginia Heilman for covering the Saturday Service and for obtaining from Thrivent a \$250 grant for the purchase of baby bottles. If there is anyone I have forgotten, please know that this thank you is meant for you as well.

A little background first. Last year Resurrection Lutheran School raised \$3,000 and the Church another \$5,000, which was a new record of financial support to Gateway, over \$8,000. Last year, we were also blessed with an anonymous donor, not connected with our Church, who added another \$5,000 to our giving credit, bringing us up to \$13,000.

This year, we do not have that anonymous donor to add to our giving. But we, as a Church family, "stepped up to the plate." The School, despite having just concluded a major fundraiser, decided they would take part again this year and they contributed some \$300. The Church family set a new giving record of over \$9,100. Thus, we were able to provide over \$9,400 to Gateway Women's Care to save more lives and support more new families.


