Pastor's Corner for March 26-April 1

Powering Through... From Life to Life (John 11:1-45)

When I used to run cross country in high school, I remember experiencing muscle cramps that made training difficult. Muscle cramps are different from what is often called “hitting the wall” or “the bonk,” a condition triggered by glycogen depletion. Unlike the debilitating feeling that comes from the bonk, most ordinary muscle cramps are limited to one part of the body and are not incapacitating. Our coach, sizing up the severity of the cramp, would usually encourage us to power through them. They were never fun at the time. But there was no avoiding them. And besides, our coach, an ultramarathon runner back in the early days of the sport, had already been there, done that, and knew how we would be best prepared to win our race. He knew what it meant to power through.

It might seem like the story of Lazarus in John's Gospel is focused on the happy event of one man's rescue from the tomb: Jesus says the word, has Lazarus released from his grave clothes, and there you have it... success. End of story. But if we begin and end our reading of this story with a sort of "Hollywood moment" at the Bethany tomb, we are missing something. The resurrection of Lazarus is embedded in a longer story. It's the story of One who will be condemned to die if He returns to Judea to help His friend (11:8, 16). Ultimately, this is the story of Jesus, put to death but not stopped by death. God could have just done away with death altogether. Instead, Jesus suffered death for us, accomplishing all that needed accomplishing to rescue us and make us whole --forever.

Lazarus's story doesn't only speak to what it means to DIE. It speaks to what it means to LIVE.

Maybe we feel the muscle cramps of life this week in the physical limitations, the aches and pains that remind us we are mortal and not destined for this world alone. Or maybe the life race we run has been recently impacted by losing someone (or the thought of losing someone) we dearly love. Jesus has powered through... from life to Life. His victory is ours! It isn't always easy, to keep running. It might even seem risky, or a little dangerous. But we have the assurance of the Victor: "I am the resurrection and the life." That assurance isn't only for the end of the race. It is for today. It is for right now. We power through, trusting that it's the power of the Lord of life in the face of death that wins.

Church Pulse Survey Feedback, Part 1

Many thanks again to all of you who took the Church Pulse Survey in January. I thought I would respond to some of the issues raised in the Comments section of the survey this week and again in a future submission to RLC Announcements after Easter. The bold portions below contain the Comments shared. My responses follow.

- **“I feel we need more people to volunteer for different service positions during our four weekly Church services.”** This was mentioned in the “Comments” section of the survey more than once. In response, I worked with the Lay Ministry Standing Committee to plan for and deploy an evening of User Training and Refresh/Review on March 21. I’m grateful for the help of the entire Committee, but especially Lori Jannings. Thanks to everyone’s efforts, we had a nice turnout! Those attending the introduction/review of the Usher Manual have now been added to a special RCB group for the purpose of updating usher guidelines and keeping folks in the loop with frequent communication. Please keep all our worship volunteers in your prayers. And if you see the need, I urge you to consider serving.
- **“I would like to have an encouragement moment for anyone to remain after service if they need spiritual comfort or needs.”** This is an activity I’ve been discussing and planning with the Resurrection Prayer Community and RLC Stephen Ministry Leaders since I first raised the issue with them in September of 2022. More recently, RLC Stephen Ministers and members of the Resurrection Prayer Community team met with me to prepare for impromptu intercessory prayer offered after our regular worship services. The first opportunity for this will be over the weekend of May 6 and 7, 2023. We will see how things go, and if this looks doable, I foresee a designated week of the month when personal prayer time with interested people could be regularly offered in the Fall.

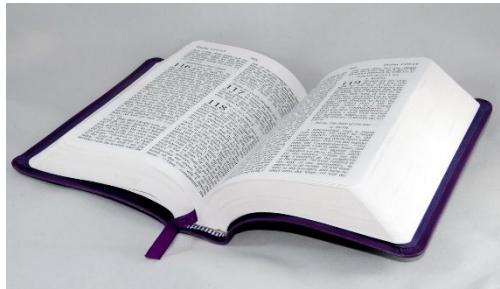

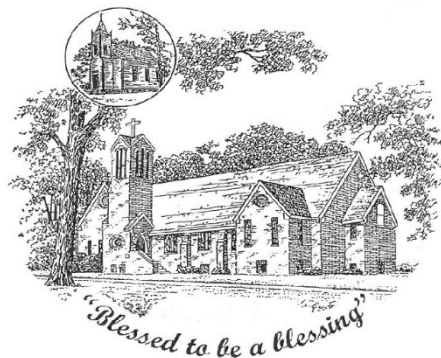
