### Mission...Impossible?

(John 20:19-31)

I used to watch the TV show "Mission Impossible." I remembered that recently when I heard of another installment of the movie version due for release later this year. The TV show always began with the opening title sequence, played with that famous theme by Lalo Schifrin and the lighting of a fuse that burned while scenes of that week's episode flash before our eyes. Then Jim Phelps would get his instructions for the mission from a tape recorder. The recording would have the same disembodied voice with the same invitation. "Your mission, Jim, should you decide to accept it..." Then the tape recorder would self-destruct, or Jim would throw it in an incinerator. The entire remainder of the show was dedicated to the unfolding of the mission, where the good guys would overcome the impossible to befuddle, humiliate, and defeat the bad guys. "Mission Impossible" was a fun television program and has been marvelously updated for the big screen. But it's a lousy way to think about the mission of the church. As St. John's gospel tells it, there's no mission of the Church for Christians to "choose" to accept. The mission of sharing God's love and promoting



justice in the world isn't for specialists or full-time agents of the Church.
All Christians, by nature of their connection to the risen Jesus through Holy Baptism (where they've received the gift of the Holy Spirit), are
ALREADY part of that mission, realize

it or not. Moreover, the mission doesn't involve befuddling, humiliating, and defeating "the bad guys." Jesus has ALREADY overcome the Enemy and everything that would overwhelm our faith! As seemingly impossible as loving on folks in need and working on behalf

### **RLC Church Council News**

### **March 2023**

- Pastor Blanke mentioned the progress we are making with the slides in the main sanctuary during the services. He expressed his gratitude for all who have stepped up and volunteered. We are now asking the congregation for feedback on the quality, size, and overall "readability."
- As was announced in the early March services, the call as RLS Principal to Jonathan Fraker was returned.
  The Call Committee and RLS Board have since met and are in the process of developing another set of
  recommendations. This may include hiring a full-time principal, because the school has been relying on
  Bob Unger as a part-time principal for about two years now and we owe this to the teachers, students
  and parents. A call may be considered in the future.
- The DCE Call is also experiencing difficulties in finding a full-time candidate. This Call Committee is now considering other options such as an internal hire (that is not a called position). Such considerations include one or more part-time employees.
- Charlie Shiel plans to retire as part-time custodian at the end of June. We thank God for his faithful service. The Council will be looking at how to fill this position during the next few meetings.
- Pastor Blanke briefly reviewed his teaching experience in Uganda at the LCU Seminary. This discussion
  was a segue into the continued Council discussion on a strategic plan for the use of the NEXT 40 Mission
  funds. Last month, we asked you all to give us feedback on your ideas for how to use about \$114,000.
  This offer for input is still good as the Council contemplates a meaningful strategic plan as "We Strive
  to Reach Out with Christ's Love to All People" (from the original NEXT 40 Charter).
- Mike Hahne, the Council Treasurer, provided updates on the endowments and finances that will be most useful for the current Budgeting process for next year. The next Budget goes to you the Voters in June 2023.
- Mike Hahne has been studying the budget line items (which are numerous) and is finding ways to stream-line things to make things more efficient.
- With the help of the Operations Director, Margaret Hyatt, the RLC Council is pursuing the Employee Retention Credit opportunity being offered by the United States Government.
- Finally, the Council began discussions on the Pulse of the Church Survey that 192 of you took a few months back. Pastor provided you the link to this information in the March Monthly Newsletter. The Council is looking for areas of improvement for which they can contribute.
- The Council is now considering monthly walk-arounds of the entire facility with Garett. If you are interested in this, please let one of us know.


