Pastor's Corner for April 16-22

The Easter Story... Parts 1 AND 2 (John 20:19-32)

Once upon a time (before I was a pastor) I had a conversation with a fellow church member about leaders in the church and church leadership in general. "I like our pastor," my conversation partner enthused. "And we have good people on our Council. I appreciate everyone's hard work. But their expectations for us as a congregation are too high, don't you think?" When I admitted I didn't see his point, he elaborated: "Don't they know Christian churches should be like hospitals for hurting people? We are needy. We are hurting. We need leaders who understand

that." My conversation partner had a point. Didn't Jesus Himself say, "It is not the HEALTHY who need a doctor, but those who are sick"? But something was missing from this vision of the church. My friend's impression of how the church should be was only an "Easter Story, Part 1" attitude. It was about checking in to the hospital... not about finding the Healer and sharing the news about Him! I admit I've been inclined to stop at Easter, Part 1, myself. I suspect you have, too. But did you notice not only did Jesus seek out His disciples and gather with them... Easter Story Part 1... but Part 2 of that story was He sent them out. That sending was to forgive and retain sins... to promote peace (forgive sins and proclaim the love of God) and to further justice (strive to live in a way that was fair and good, and encourage others to the same). There is a kind of inhaling and exhaling performed by Easter people. Being gathered, being sent. Being gathered, being sent. Thank God we had the opportunity to gather last Easter Sunday. What a day it was! But I'm also grateful for the "Part 2" of the Easter story: we've found life and we're empowered by the risen Lord Jesus to share it with others. There are few things as exciting and rewarding as facilitating another person's encounter with the Great Physician! As we begin a new sermon series this weekend ("Blessed are the Peacemakers") let's all consider again how God is sending us as Easter people to a world wracked with conflict, strife, and despair with a message of hope and reconciliation.

Adult Sunday School Class Poetry and Our Christian Faith

Poets have often addressed the key issues of life, such as love, faith, hope, grief, and death. CLI Prison Alliance

Does CLI Prison Alliance do more than provide Christian books and Bibles to inmates? Yes, definitely! They provide free responsive-based Bible studies that disciple and equip inmates to become disciple-makers. The "Who Is God?" series invites prisoners to begin a relationship with Christ. The "Christian Leadership" and "Disciples of Christ" courses help them mature in their faith. Chaplains identify those who want to enroll, inmates study and write their responses, and they return them to CLI. More than 200 Bible study ministers review the lessons at home, give feedback, and write encouraging remarks. They send the lessons back to inmates in an envelope provided by CLI. Last year 29,067 made decisions for Christ.

Can I become a Bible study minister? Please do! There are four at Resurrection who do this: Marina de Moura Torres, Kathy Rihani, Charlotte Beyer, and Ann Johnson. Stop at the table in the Narthex before and after services the next two weekends to ask questions and learn how you can make an eternal difference in the life of a prisoner. If you speak a foreign language, we encourage you to volunteer. Both men and women find great rewards from being Bible study ministers.

Are there other ways to volunteer at Christian Library International Prison Alliance? Certainly! Sign up for Operation Inasmuch and come with the group going on the church bus to the CLI office on Saturday, April 29. Or go online at cli.world.
