Pastor's Corner for April 30-May 6

What's In a Name? (John 14:1-14)

Jesus' famous words to His disciples on the night before His betrayal ("I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life") are a familiar promise often heard at funerals. As we hear those words again this Sunday, I'm reminded of the special significance celebrating Jesus as "the Way" has for all of us, especially in this Easter season.

During my years in Japan, I discovered that many people I encountered were familiar with the notion of a particular mode of life described by that word "way." "Shinto" (神道), literally meaning "way of the gods," refers to a host of practices associated with Japanese folk religion. "Bushido" (武士道), or "way of the warrior," designates a life path followed by samurai warriors who were supposed to put loyalty, respect, courage, and personal honor first. How interesting when set alongside the history of early Christian church! Christians did not call themselves "Christian" (see Acts 11:26) or even "followers of Christ" (those who do so are scolded by Paul in 1 Corinthians!). Rather, they made known their identity as people of "the Way" (Acts 9:2, 19:9, etc.). What's in a name? Notice, the name chosen was not people of "a way" or "the way of [something or someone]." It was simply, "the Way." I love that, don't you? I mean, first off, there's something intriguing about a name like that that leaves a person wanting to know more! But "the Way" not only calls to mind the original song of the prophet Isaiah quoted by John the Baptist at the inauguration of Jesus' ministry (Mk 1:3). It echoes the words of Jesus who promised, "I go to prepare a place for you," and when His disciples express confusion about WHERE that meant Jesus was headed, He simply said, "I AM THE WAY, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

The world will judge us by our actions, it is true. There is far more to the life of the Way than mere head knowledge or good intentions alone. Yet that is where the One who is the Way the Truth and the Life comes in. Jesus went away to the cross to prepare a place of fellowship with a holy and merciful God for sinners like you and me. In life, ours is not a list of do's and don'ts to follow. Ours is not a code of ethics to either uphold with honor or live in shame over failing to fulfill. Ours instead, is a journey of fellowship with the One who went where we could not to win Life for us. How can our actions and behavior NOT reflect the wonder of that gift!

Christ is risen! What's in a name? Because the One who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life lives in us and is with us, we are people of the Way, empowered to love and serve. What greater privilege can there be?
