# Sixth Sunday After Pentecost July 9, 2023



Pastor's Corner for July 9-15

Who needs "For I desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out." (Romans 7:18b)

I'm sure there are more times than we care to admit when this is the refrain of our lives. With Paul, we may see the sin in the world or the sin in our lives, wanting to do something about it, while having no idea what to do. We may be stuck in an addiction or habit that we gave up trying to fight long ago. There may be a family member or friend that is in cycle of self-harm and you're at a loss for how to help. You may look at our community and country, wondering how we got here, finding yourself drowning in fear and anger, desiring to do something good, anything to benefit others, but knowing that you cannot do it on your own.

It's a lonely place to be, wanting to do good, but not able to live it out the way that God calls us to. That's the inner struggle Paul speaks to in his letter to the Romans. It's the struggle that God's people have been fighting against since Adam and Eve. Even our first parents wanted to do what was right when they ate the fruit. They thought that it was the right choice, even though they were lied into a state of misplaced desires. So, where do we go when we are stuck in this lonely, sometimes dark and stagnant middle ground between desire for good and our own inability to do the good?

First, we need to define what is truly good and right. The only place where we can know and find what is truly good and right is in the W ord of God. In God's W ord, breathed into our hearts in baptism, worked into our lives by the Spirit, we see what God's desires are for our lives and for all of His creation. We must be continually in God's W ord for our desires to align with His and for God to then use us in the places He intentionally puts us. It is in God's W ord that we find what God wants for the world, mainly for "all people to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4).

Second, we need to be reminded of God's promises. This too is found in God's W ord, as well as being the habitual prayer of our hearts. When we are continually reminded of God's promises, our desires are focused on the Kingdom to come and living out God's Kingdom work here. When we are focused on God's promises and desires, we are reminded of what is to come, and when that is in the forefront of our hearts and minds, we see that we are a part of something so much bigger than ourselves.

"Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is He...Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double." (Zechariah 9:9, 12)

With the proper understanding of what is good and right according to God's Word and the promise of God's Kingdom inheritance for us, at work now, we are strengthened with God's ability to do what is right. It is not our own strength, not

our own wisdom, not our own understanding, not our own will or desire at work within us, but that of our Savior working in you as His Kingdom people.

At Vacation Bible School, we saw God's Kingdom at work among His people as they lived out the desires of God, shining His light into the lives of 170+ kids and their families. We cannot say "thank you" enough to all of you that served God's church at VBS!

For those with the "desire to do what is right" but not sure where to start, take a tag off of one of our Christmas trees during the month of July. Christmas in July is a great way to live out God's Kingdom work this summer!




#### Summer Adult Christian Ed Class


