Pastor's Corner for July 23-29

Endurance athletes amaze me.

No matter what the event may be, swimming, biking, running, or any other endurance event, I find it so incredible that people would be willing to put their bodies and minds through such pain. When an endurance athlete is asked what gets them through the event, they often answer, "the finish line." When you think about it, that is a pretty silly answer when the reality is, they are the ones that put themselves at the start line!

Life may feel like an endurance race at times, the biggest difference between you and I and other endurance athletes is that we didn't put ourselves at the start line.

We were given this life as a gift from God, but it can be a pretty hard life at times. We all have struggles that we may face. Struggles that could cause us to doubt our faith or God's credibility. Struggles that can cause us to treat others poorly, look with hate upon those that God has given to us for His purposes. Struggles that may cause us to hate ourselves and question our place on this earth. These struggles may fade from time to time, but for many of us, the only guarantee we may feel is that the struggles will always come back.

This world can be hard to slog through at times. During an endurance event, there always comes a time when you "hit a wall." It's that time in the race that your body is doing everything it can to tell you to stop. There is pain and regret that causes many athletes to hobble to the side of the course, sit down, and never get back up. If you have the mental capacity to face the struggle, and keep moving through the wall, you know that you can finish the race and reach the celebration that is waiting at the end.

"For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be reveal to us." (Romans 8:18)

As Christians, we are the only people on this earth that know what is coming. For those who believe, there is an eternal glory bursting at the seams in anticipation for the day that we arrive at the finish line! Knowing what God has for you in the future and what He does for you now (Romans 8:26), we are equipped with the mental capacity to endure what God has placed before us. We are not people without hope, but we have the living hope that leads to life everlasting (Romans 8:23-25). And in this hope, we are spurred on to share this finish line joy with others so that more and more may know with confidence the glory waiting to be reveal to the children of God.

On **July 16-21**, our High School Youth travelled to Savannah, Georgia through the YouthWorks program and participated in a weeklong Mission Trip. Due to the health epidemics and trips to the National Youth Gathering, this was our first Mission Trip in 5 years. So grateful for this opportunity and doing God's work with our hands!

Over 20% of Savannah's population lives below the poverty line with rises in homelessness and lack of affordable housing options. We partnered with missions like Union Mission (working to eliminate homelessness), Salvation Army, helped community members through minor home repair projects to make their homes safe, and other community organizations getting food to those in need. As our own group has felt the effects of the Covid epidemic, this community has also been severely impacted.

Our group of 8 youth and 3 adult leaders have arrived home safely. Thank you for all the prayers!

A special thank you to Harrison Hulse for devoting his time and talents developing activities and devotions with me to bring a really special opportunity to the HS RLC Youth. Thank you to Heather Burgiss for taking a week to spend with our youth to form deeper relationships within our group and with our community.
