

Pastor's Corner for August 20-26

One Heart, One Mind (Philippians 2:2)

If you come to Resurrection this week, you'll notice things are a little busier than normal. The 2023-2024 academic year for Resurrection Lutheran School has begun! It is a very exciting time of the year with both RLS and RLP starting in back-to-back weeks. As a church staff, we absolutely love having all the kids around and interacting with our faculty and staff. It is an incredible ministry that we are humbled to be a part of, serving these three institutions of Resurrection Lutheran Church, Resurrection Lutheran School, and Resurrection Lutheran Preschool.

But we aren't as separate as we may think. Sure, there are technical things that separate the three institutions, but what are we called to? Who are we called by?

The theme for RLS this year is "One Heart, One Mind" coming from Philippians 2:2 which reads...

complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind.

It's the reminder of the unity to which we are called as children of God. We are brought into a family, united by the blood of Christ, sharing the same Father with our Savior. But the unity of family can, at times, be difficult for some to understand. Families, more often than we like to admit, are broken. There is division and hate in families that can cause an ugly form of disunity, therefore creating different hearts and different minds. While I still love the image of the family of God, I understand why it isn't a comforting image for others. That is why Paul uses so many different images for the people of God.

In 1 Corinthians 12, Paul talks about the people of God as the body of Christ...

For the body does not consist of one member but of many...

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

(1 Cor. 12:14, 27)

There is a unity in the body that can only come about by the Creator. It is a unity that is created by the very hand of God, and it is a unity that cannot be separated. The unity that we have in Christ with One Heart, One Mind can only come because we are the body of Christ and Christ is the head of that body (Colossians 2:19). When we share the same head, we have no choice but to be united with Christ, changed by the Holy Spirit to share, One Heart, One Mind. It is one of the many joyful blessings of God, knowing that we do not go through this life alone, but we journey through this life with the whole body of Christ, the entire family of God.

So, this school year, don't let our students, families, faculty, and staff journey alone. Whether they are members of RLC, RLS, or RLP, we are all of One Heart, One Mind by the Resurrection of our Savior. If you continue reading the rest of Philippians chapter 2, you'll see that the people of God are united with One Heart, One Mind so that we may be humbled to serve one another. Service begins with prayer.

Journey with the students, families, faculty, and staff of Resurrection with prayerful hearts. Pray that they may know the love of God, be led by the Spirit, kept safe in the arms of the Father, and united as the body of Christ.




Summer Adult Christian Ed Class


Come learn more about it on **Tuesday, August 22** at 10:00 am in the Fellowship Hall.


