# Seeing the Possibilities in Each Other (Matthew 14:22-33)

One of my earliest experiences of the Holy Spirit working to build me into His church and empower me as a follower of Christ happened in my late 20's. My parents had been super active at church when I was a kid growing up. Then, during my college years, I stopped going. I had head knowledge of Jesus. I believed the Christian faith to be a worthy thing. But things were static. That changed when I finally felt called to return to church on my own. At first, I just worked at showing up most Sundays. Then I helped out with odd jobs, here and there. But then... the pastor of the little church I attended took ill. The congregation managed to line up pulpit supply for several upcoming Sundays, but there was one week they just couldn't get anybody. So, somebody asked if I could prepare a devotion for one

Sunday morning. Of course, my response was "no." That was crazy. Didn't they know it was against the rules for an ordinary guy like me to stand in for the pastor? Then, this salt-of-the-earth guy in the congregation offered to help. He'd look over my devotion and offer advice. He'd bring in a pastor he knew to help. We'd do it TOGETHER, he said. With his encouragement, I gave it a shot. And as it turned out, it wasn't the disaster I thought it would be. I still just showed up most Sundays and helped out here and there. But serving in a way I'd never considered before started to look more and more possible as a result. I used to wonder why that salt-of-the-earth guy in the congregation didn't just volunteer to do the job himself that Sunday. He would have done a much better job! All I can think is that he must have seen something in me. In Christ Jesus, that's what happens. We see possibilities in each other. In Christ Jesus each one of us is built up, together.

Like Peter, we know what it's like to get out of the boat and flail... We know what it's like to take on that God-sized task and whether because we think too much of ourselves or not enough of God, we sink! All we can do is cry out for help. Or perhaps we know what it means to get into a routine and to no longer think that inspiration or change or joy can be found anywhere. And yet, together with Peter, our confession once again today —that Jesus is the "Christ, the Son of the Living God"— is the result of the Spirit's work in and among us. The church belongs to Jesus and receives the gifts of the kingdom —especially the Word of God— to be proclaimed in the narrow sense by pastors and in the wider sense by Christians everywhere. We all have a role to play; we all have gifts God uses to build up His Church. St. Paul says so in our Epistle: "For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another."

Jesus saw the possibilities in St. Peter. Seeing the possibilities in one another, let us never stop praising God AND empowering each other for new tasks that grow us. Praise God that ALL have a part to play for service in God's kingdom!
