

Pastor's Corner for September 3-9

# Real Christians (Romans 12:9-21)

Have you seen the show *How I Met Your Mother*? It's a sitcom from the 2000's about a group of friends in their 20's and 30's struggling to survive in New York City. They didn't all grow up in NYC, so in one episode they argue over what makes a real New Yorker. You're not a real new Yorker, they argue, until... you cry in the subway, steal a cab from someone, kill a cockroach with your bare hand, etc. Now I've never been to NYC, so I have no idea if any of these things are true, but you get the idea.

I wonder what that list would look for "real North Carolinians", I'm sure I would have a low score, though with time and experience I hope that score would improve! Throughout the summer we've been reading through the book of Romans in church. This weekend is Romans 12:9-21, which sounds like an episode of *How I Met Your Mother*, "You're not a real Christian until \_\_\_\_\_." In my ESV Bible, there's even a subheading that says, "Marks of the True Christian" and as I read through these verses, I quickly start to wonder, "am I a true Christian?".

These 13 verses sound like a list of do's and don'ts that belong in the Old Testament. The list goes on and on; "let love be genuine", "be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer", "bless and do not curse", "weep with those who weep", "do what is honorable." Reading these I can't help but think of all the times I've failed to do any of these "marks of a true Christian." If this was a list of what we have to do to be a real Christian, I'd say it would be easier to be a real New Yorker!

So, what do we do about it? Do we throw it all away because it's impossible? Do we try harder to be "real Christians?" We can't fall into either of these two categories, instead, when we are left floundering with questions such as these, when we are fearful of our own ability to be a real Christian we have to immediately turn to Christ. What has He done when we can't do anything?

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through Him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God." (Romans 5:1-

2)

We don't make ourselves real Christians, it is the work of Christ creating faith within us that makes us real Christians. We can do nothing to obtain that identity, it is all the work of our Savior and once He has done that work, nobody can take it away from us. It's an eternal work, an everlasting work, a God work. Now, having been made real Christians by the blood of Christ, we are free to live out (Romans 12:9-21).

Freed from our sin and our failures, we are continually learning what it means to be real Christians together. We have lots of opportunities to grow in that learning with

## Mama Bear Apologetics... Also for Papa Bears


Join us for this book study beginning **September 5 and 6**!







## Meant for Good: A Study of Joseph

A devotional journey through the life of Joseph, Genesis 30-50.



Everyone remembers Joseph from Sunday School days! But how often have you stopped to think about Joseph's life as a kind of "spiritual boot camp" that parallels your own? As author Donna Snow writes, "The amazing truth about God's spiritual boot camp (basically, our whole life) is that He never leaves us. Ever. ... In Joseph, we see Christlike qualities and parallels to apply to our Christian walk. We can choose to become victims of our circumstances, or we can trust God to bring beauty from ashes every single time. Joseph's biography occupies more space in Genesis than those of Adam, Noah, Abraham, or even Joseph's own father, Jacob. Even though that should be reason enough to study Joseph's incredible journey, he also experiences family conflict and unfair treatment, which many of us can relate to today. ... Perhaps you and I can relate to waterless pits and unfairness in our lives. By the end of the story, God uses Joseph to provide invaluable insights regarding how to live out wise, bold journeys of faith in our everyday Christian walk."

This study is accompanied by an optional daily devotion throughout the week that

builds on the conversations we have on Sundays. If you're looking for an opportunity to be immersed in God's Word and enjoy conversation on important topics with your faith family at Resurrection, now is your chance!

This book is published by Concordia Publishing House and written by Donna Snow. 10 books have been purchased for \$15/book. 
## Monday Night Women's Bible Study
