Pastor's Corner for September 10-16

Tough Love for God's Beloved (Ezekiel 33:7-11)

Most of us are blessed to have had someone in our past who exercised "tough love" with us. For me, one of those folks was a high school history teacher. He was about as far away from the "carpe deum" Dead-Poets-Society sort as you could get. His methods were prosaic. He probably didn't realize it, but he played favorites. His greatest shortcoming, however, in my eyes at the time, concerned his love for outlines. We could highlight, make notecards of important people, laws, and battlefields... but all of that wasn't enough. No, our homework was to write outlines of all the content in our textbook! It seemed like one of the most pointless exercises ever created for young, creative minds. I simply didn't DO outlines. My mind didn't... couldn't... think in such conventional terms, I remember thinking. But this guy, it turns out, had dealt with whiners like me, before. And we didn't make much of an impression, apparently. Before we realized it, the first assessments

came due. Mine was a disaster. But over time, I finally started reading to distinguish foundational content from less important detail. I started DOING outlines. I didn't sail through the class. I passed. But it's a funny thing about those outlines. Many years later, when I was working on a degree and taking entrance examinations on assigned readings, can you guess how I prepared? Nobody made me do it. But I discovered, to my great amazement, that outlines helped me master content! My teacher's tough love for US had benefited ME.

In the appointed readings for this weekend, we discover one necessary aspect of life in our shared community is experienced through God's own brand of "tough love." For the prophet Ezekiel, that came in the call to give the people of Israel, God's beloved, a warning... a warning because they either refused to see or wanted to downplay the seriousness of their own waywardness. Our witnessing God's "tough love" in action might not occur solely or even primarily through the people of our own church family at Resurrection. But what is emphasized in our appointed readings this week is this: God's work in us enabling us to love our brother or sister in the faith so much that we either speak a difficult truth to them or receive it from them for our mutual good and the glory of God.

Last Sunday our text introduced us to so much more than just the call to pick up and carry our crosses. It brought us face to face with the original Cross Carrier Himself: Jesus Christ. The Good Life is based not on finding comfort in receiving more of what the world finds meaningful... what Jesus calls "saving our lives." It is found in the abundant grace of God so that by GOD'S strength we give... we serve... we love... come what may tomorrow. The truly Good Life is all about being forgiven, being delighted in by the One in whom we have been baptized... it means that in "losing our lives" we actually end up finding them.

It's never fun or easy at the time, but sooner or later, a Word of God's much needed tough love is ours both to hear from and to share with others. In Christ Jesus, may God's Holy Spirit give us the sensitivity to speak it and the willingness to hear it, that we might live!




Sunday Adult Christian Education

This study is accompanied by an optional daily devotion throughout the week that builds on the conversations we have on Sundays. If you're looking for an opportunity to be immersed in God's Word and enjoy conversation on important topics with your faith family at Resurrection, now is your chance!





Mama Bear Apologetics... Also for Papa Bears




