Pastor's Corner for October 8-14

Joys of Gardening (Isaiah 5:1-7)

Gardening has always been a part of my life, but recently I have finally been able to have a garden I call my own. After years of weeding my parents' gardens, earning pay for working side-jobs, and laboring over the gardens of Concordia Ann Arbor and Concordia Seminary, I finally felt the joy of working in my own garden and reaping the fruit (and vegetables!) that it produced. There was a certain sense of pride and contentment in watching my raised beds go from regular grass in the back yard to wooden beds (I made myself!) to beds with dirt to planted seeds to green stuff we could eat! It certainly was a lot of fun, if not for the labor and pain gardening can sometimes bring. If you have ever tried gardening, you know it isn't all joy and pride. There are numerous things that can go wrong with a garden; insects and grubs can eat away at the plant, there can be too much sun and water or not enough, there could be rabbits and deer that eat away the leaves, there can be inattentive gardeners that don't know enough, and there are the times when the seed just decides to not grow at all.

I hope you took the time to read Isaiah 5:1-7 before reading this article (if not stop and do that!). It starts with a beautiful image of our Creator, Father God, the vinedresser (John 15:1), planting a vineyard and caring for it, only for it to produce wild grapes. It's a story that we know well in the Bible. God created everything perfect, only for that perfect creation to rebel against the love of God to try and reach God.

They tried to reach God even though He was already walking with them, and we still do the same. We make gods out of our own desires, our own anger, our own justification, our own laziness, hate, lust, and any number of sins that plague our lives.

What does our Creator, Vinedresser God do to His garden that rebelled, that produced wild grapes instead of what He planted? Verses 4-5 tell us what He will do. He will remove its protection so it will be devoured, stomped on, overgrown with weeds, and dried up. It will become a waste place. Not a pretty picture, far from the perfection that He started with and not the destination we hope for.


But this wrath of the Vinedresser is not meant for us, it is meant for Jesus, the Vine (John 15:1), who became a "curse for us" (Gal. 3:13), who took upon Himself "our griefs... sorrows... transgressions... and iniquities" (Is. 53:4-5). The wrath of God over His imperfect garden was all laid upon His Son, our Savior, so that we may be given life, the fruit of the Son and a place in the vineyard of our Creator, Father God.

Because of the sacrifice of the Son of God, we now abide in Christ, the Vine, to produce fruit for the Vinedresser (John 15). This is our joy and attitude of gratitude, abiding with Christ and working with Him in His garden. May we always remember

the work of Christ for us, where we belong in the garden, and the joy-filled work we are given to work alongside Him.

Blessing of the Quilts and Silent Auction

All Services, October 7 and 8

Blessing of the Quilts will be at all services this weekend, **October 7/8**. There will also be a Silent Auction Fundraiser, which will include a variety of handmade quilted items.

The Piecemakers, RLC's Quilting Group, make hand-tied quilts for two organizations - Sleep in Heavenly Peace and Lutheran World Relief.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace ministers to children locally who are in need of beds and blankets. The Piecemakers donated 30 warm and cheerful children's quilts to this ministry in November 2022.

The Quilt Ministry is Lutheran World Relief's longest running program. LWR

distributed its first quilts in 1945 to families in war-torn Europe following the Second World War. Within a decade, the ministry was reaching around the globe to villages far removed from the world's attention. Quilts can be used as warm bedding, room dividers, simple tents, or floor coverings.

In 2022, Lutheran World Relief distributed over 220,000 quilts to 19 countries with a focus on Angola, Georgia, and the Polish/Ukraine area. The quilts on display are just a portion of the 250 quilts that were made this year. They will be shipped to the Lutheran World Relief warehouse in Maryland, and we pray that these quilts will be a blessing for each recipient as they are sent abroad.



We want to thank everyone who donated fabric for quilt tops and bed sheets for the quilt backs. Please, keep the donations coming! You can drop them off at the church office or in the donation bins across from the mailboxes.

We also want to thank the more than 20 ladies who worked on these quilts! It takes many hands to complete just one quilt and we have been busy. Not all of the jobs on a quilt need a sewing machine. So, if you are interested in giving us an extra pair of hands, we can find the right job that fits your expertise. 




