Pastor's Corner for November 5-11

That Day that Gloriously Trumps "All Hallows' Eve" (Revelation 7:9-17)

Last Tuesday, between 6 and 8 PM, I counted roughly thirty people on Juli's and my front doorstep. There were a couple of animals. There was at least one princess. And there were several "Marios." There were members of the older set, done up in skeleton suits and funny hair. Halloween is that yearly tradition that allows folks to be creative. It gives us the chance to connect with the kids in our neighborhoods... even if only for a few seconds as we guess who the ghosts and goblins ringing our doorbell are. Those of us who grew up with the Halloween movie franchise in the 70s may not immediately unpack October 31 in terms that are wholesome and family friendly. But no matter what else you might say about "All Hallows' Eve," the day coming immediately AFTER it, All Saints' Day, is truly worth celebrating! It is a day we mark this weekend, on November 4 and 5. The reason? All Saints' Day (a day we call "Commemoration of the Faithful Departed") reminds us of who truly is in charge over life and death. It's neither Michael Myers nor the Grim Reaper. It is

Jesus. It is the Lord of the empty tomb!

Some time ago, a seminary professor of mine who liked to take on the occasional sacred cow, Dr. H. Armin Moellering, once wrote a piece in the Lutheran Witness on Halloween and All Saints' Day. It was back in the day when many Christian schools would not dare unleash a little fun involving jack-o-lanterns or spooky costumes. I remember he lamented what he saw as a trend of Christians acting like they were afraid of the Devil. Halloween was a chance to poke the Devil in the eye! the good professor wrote. The biggest blasphemy to be waged against the forces of evil, he said, was to live as if they have the final word. And because of Jesus, they don't. All Saints' Day is a day to take heart and rejoice because our tears WILL be wiped away. Or as G. Lee Ramsey puts it, "That wild thing Death -- that thing running around your porches, slipping under your bed at night, hanging out in your hospitals, tormenting your cities, wrecking this good earth -- that thing death, Jesus has already put a stake through his heart. We call that stake... the cross." Sinners of God, by the love of God in Jesus Christ, have been made saints.

So on this "All Saints" weekend we gather to celebrate that because of Jesus and our baptism into his death and resurrection, death is now behind us, too. It doesn't mean that sin, death, and the Devil aren't still around. But Death is down for the count. The saints that precede us to glory are experiencing this! So, let's gather to sing. Let's tell the stories of the sinners declared to be saints who have touched our lives and who have graced the pages of Holy Scripture. Let the ghosts and goblins of Halloween have their day. A better day has followed.



• Children, age 7 and older with their parent or responsible adult, may help bag the food in an assembly line that ends with a sealed bag of dry food.


 Children younger than 7 years old will decorate the boxes that hold the bags of packaged food. There will be adult supervision for this age group of children.
