# From the Pastor I love Thanksgiving!

What I may love most about Thanksgiving though, is its lack of prominence in the world of commerce. As you're running errands on any given day from about mid-October through December, you will find Christmas decorations galore. Even Easter items start to show up alongside Valentine treats. The world has taken advantage of almost every church celebration, and then there is Thanksgiving, a holiday that stands alone in its significance and purpose in our relationship with God.


### Meant for Good: A Study of Joseph

A devotional journey through the life of Joseph, Genesis 30-50.

As author Donna Snow writes, "The amazing truth about God's spiritual boot camp (basically, our whole life) is that He never leaves us. Ever.

In Joseph, we see Christlike qualities and parallels to apply to our Christian walk. We can choose to become victims of our circumstances, or we can trust God to bring beauty from ashes every single time.

Proclaiming thanksgiving aloud, and telling all Your wondrous deeds. Psalm 26:7

Thankfulness is meant to be proclaimed, shouted from the rooftops, and celebrated! We are thankful for the goodness of God that has entered into our lives. Whether it be the big flashing acts of God, or the little, day-to-day, moments that we often overlook God is the One who gives us every good and perfect gift (James 1:17). Around the Thanksgiving table, we have an opportunity to share what God has done for you over the past year. How can you verbally show your thankfulness to God this season? It isn't selfish to talk about God to others, and during the holiday season others may be more ready to hear God's works for you than at other times of the year.

I will offer to you the sacrifice of thanksgiving and call on the name of the Lord. Psalm 116:17

Thankfulness is meant to be lived out, worked into our daily lives! Recognizing that all we have comes from God, our lives are then ordered in a different manner (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Thankfulness leads to selflessness, because then all we can do is give back to God through giving back to others. How is God calling you to live out thankfulness this season?

## Church Council News

## October 2023

- During our October Council Meeting, we addressed facility, maintenance, and budget issues.
- One of the HVAC systems supporting the schools failed during the early summer. Installation was scheduled for mid-October at a cost of about \$33,000.
- The Resurrection facilities are aging and repairs are now becoming more common. The roof line between the Sanctuary and Narthex is leaking and estimates for this repair varied greatly. The vendor chosen will make these roof repairs in late October.
- The Council is now considering how best to address maintenance issues before they become too expensive. Regularly scheduled walk arounds and inspections were discussed, as well as the possibility of other volunteer efforts.
- The General Fund contributions are far behind the expenditures for the first three months of our July-June Fiscal Year. This is common for this time of year and it is hoped November and December donations will help improve the situation. All members can find the Expense Statement in the RCB Account (Login to RCB / Click on Entire Church Group / Click on FILES).
- The Endowment Committee has undergone some changes during the past few months. Lisa Snyder and Scott Ferguson are now our permanent members, with Mike Hahne (Council Treasurer) as an ex-officio member.
- The 2023 RLC Council continued its strategic distribution of The Next 40 Mission Funds by approving \$5500 for Kids Against Hunger.
- Don't forget the next Voter's Meeting will be Sunday, December 10 at 12:45 pm in the Family Life Center. The Agenda will include election of 6 Council Members, Pastor's Report, School Report, Preschool Report, and an update from the Endowment Committee.

#### Join us in the Sanctuary for Worship and Holy Communion on Wednesday, November 22 at 7:00 pm!



## **Blessing of the Quilts and Silent Auction**

Thank you for all your contributions for our Lutheran World Relief mission quilt and Sleep in Heavenly Peace projects, both your purchases and donations are greatly appreciated! Without all your contributions, we would not be able to reach as many people and families as we do. Our auction this year brought in \$3,015 which will be used to purchase batting all year round and have some of our handmade quilts longarm for next year.

The Piecemakers, RLC's quilting group, is unique with about 20 women — some working from home while others come into the building to work on Tuesdays. When fabric is donated, it is washed and ironed, so it can be cut into squares or stripes. The squares will be laid out making sure they look correct and put into kits to be sewn together. The strips are taken home and made into or added to quilt tops. We then sew the quilt kits Together; this can be done in their homes at their convenience. Those that come into the building on Tuesdays, sandwich the quilt tops with the batting and the backing. Some will then take them home, sew around them, turn and top stitch, then brought back into the building so it can be delivered or picked up to be tied. Once tied, it is done and ready to be stored until October when we have them all blessed by our congregation. They are boxed, weighed, and ready to be delivered to Grace Lutheran in Raleigh. From Raleigh, they are picked up by a semi-truck and taken to the Lutheran World Relief warehouse in Maryland.

As you can see we are unique and without all the hands to do this work plus your continued support, we would not be as successful as we are. If you would like to be a part of this unique group, please come join us on Tuesdays in January, from 1:00-3:00 pm in Room 151, Family Life Center. Please continue to pray for all those around the world needing our love, comfort, and support with a quilt.

Want to have fun and help kids who are hungry? All families are invited to join in a food packaging event with a mission of feeding families around the world.

How does it work?

Participants make an assembly line on two sides of a 10-foot table. Using a funnel between the first 4 people, each of the 4 will add a scoop of their ingredient (rice, beans, spices, etc.), then pass the bag to the next person in the assembly line for sealing and labeling of the bag. Finally, bags are packed in boxes for shipping. All supplies are provided! <u>Check out this video!</u>

Parents and children of all ages are invited to participate.

- Children, age 7 and older with their parent or responsible adult, may help bag the food in an assembly line that ends with a sealed bag of dry food.
- Children younger than 7 years old will decorate the boxes that hold the bags of packaged food. There will be adult supervision for this age group of children.

Not your jam to lead? That's ok. We need worshippers as well. Come and support your fellow youth. Hear about the ways Jesus is at work within the youth programs at RLC.


### Decorate the Church for Christmas! Sunday, November 26 from 12:30-3:00 pm
