Pastor's Corner for December 3-9

Ongoing Repentance (Mark 1:1-8)

Maybe it's because so much preparation is required for one thing or another this time of year that the words of John the Baptist ("Prepare ye the way of the Lord!") seem to add yet another item to our expanding "to-do" list. We hear the call to repentance from John the Baptist and are tempted to sigh out loud. "OK. Add church duties and worship services to the list of things that have to get done in December," that inner rascal says! Of course, I hope and pray that worship and service IS on your short list of things to do this season. But what does John the Baptist really mean... and how does his message impact our waiting— and receiving— Jesus?

John's words have to do with repentance. But repentance is often misunderstood.

There are two kinds of repentance. One kind happens once-and-for-all... when the Holy Spirit calls people to faith in the Lord of the cross, and there is a 180-degree turning... from unfaith to faith, from death to life. But there is also another kind of repentance, an ongoing repentance for followers of Jesus. This ongoing repentance occurs whenever the Holy Spirit leads us to encounter God's holy Law, own up to our own brokenness, and receive the grace of God to find wholeness today and renewed strength for tomorrow. Ongoing repentance never stops! As Martin Luther once famously wrote, "Our Lord and Master Jesus Christ, when He said ['Repent!'], willed that the LIFE of believers [emphasis mine] should be repentance." Ongoing repentance, then, isn't a matter of going from unfaith to faith. And it isn't necessarily a matter of our "doing" anything at all. It is all about being led by the Spirit from a recognition of our own shortcomings in the eyes of a holy God to gratitude: gratitude to the One who forgives us and loves us in Jesus, despite those shortcomings. It is all about the cross of Jesus, where we find lasting peace and true spiritual restoration. "Preparing the way" only happens in the first place because of the unexpected victory already accomplished by the One who has come... is coming now...and will come again.

This Advent we hear again the call to "Prepare the way of the Lord." Let's focus first and foremost on the power and the mercy of the One who is coming: our Savior, Jesus Christ. Resting in the mercy of our loving Lord Jesus we can be sure that the truly necessary preparations of the season have already been taken care of.


