Pastor's Corner for December 10-16

## Get Ready! (John 1:6-8, 19-28)

Christmas seems like a never-ending season of preparation. The long daunting list always before you: buy plane tickets, clean the house, buy presents, decorate tree, hang lights, all on top of the normal things like keeping your kids alive and sleeping for a least a couple hours a night! All that preparation and stress all for one big day that you hope to be relaxing but ends up being more running around and preparation for the next thing. While it might be a lot of work, it's only appropriate that our homes are full of preparation during these Advent days because Advent is all about preparation.

For this reason, we spend time with John the Baptist during Advent. His whole job was to prepare people for Jesus' ministry. John was very blatant about the Mission God gave him, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord'" (John 1:23). He's the guy to get everyone ready for the Light that was coming into the world to shine in the darkness (John 1:5, 8). That is the reason we put up Christmas lights during Advent. Sure, they're pretty and everything, but they are to remind us of the one true Light that has come for you.

Every morning, the first thing I do is plug in the lights on our Christmas tree. It's a perfect start to my day. In the midst of the darkness of the kitchen and living room, all of a sudden there shines the multi-color strands of light, shining through the branches of our Fraser Fir. On my way to plugging in the tree, I usually trip over things; my shoes laid out the night before, the chair I didn't push in, the dog racing to his yet-to-be-filled food bowl, but once those lights arrive the room is brought to life.

Christ is that Light that brings the world to life! Without Him, there would be only darkness always, but He came to bring Light and Life to all people. Our own lives are seen in a new light because of the Light that shines forth through us and into us, though it may be a dim light at the moment (1 Corinthians 13:12). We still live in a sinful world. Those lights on my Christmas tree aren't enough to illuminate the entire home. There are still some dark corners, even right next to the tree I couldn't read my morning magazine with breakfast unless there's brighter light. That is the Light we are preparing for now, that is the Light that is promised to come (Revelation 22:5)!

Christmas is a season of never-ending preparation, because the Christian life is a season of never-ending preparation. Christmas is more than celebrating the birth of the Savior for all people (though we can't miss that!). Just as John was preparing people for the ministry of Jesus, we are still preparing for Jesus.
