Pastor's Corner for December 17-23

## Here I Am (2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16; Luke 1:26-38)

Have you ever found yourself called by God at a crossroads in life and responded, "Here I am"? Consider two people in the Scriptures: one in the Old Testament and one in the New.

First comes King David, a king of Israel who was probably used to getting his way. Would it be any wonder if his default mode was to tell God his plans? He checks in with the prophet Nathan about a building project, a "house" he wants to build for God. David made his list of priorities. Then, he made his plans. But God had other plans for David! Now consider Mary, the future mother of Jesus. An angel came to tell Mary she would bear a child who would be the Son of God. Such an angelic announcement changed Mary's world overnight. Mary knew the social consequences for women in her day who carried children before they were married. She and the baby could be put to death in an honor killing by the very villagers who had raised Mary as a child. What would she tell her parents? How would her betrothed (Joseph) find out? God had extraordinary plans for Mary she could never have imagined. God's plan, in a miraculous way, becomes her plan, too.

To be fair, we have neither a prophet nor an angel whispering in our ear, telling us what God's plan for us might or might not be. To discern God's purpose, we search the Scriptures. We ask others for their insights. We do a painfully honest "gut-check" to see where our own instincts are leading us. It's when the wrong instincts – our fear, our pride – or the desires of our heart get the upper hand that we need God to interrupt our plans. We'll never know with complete certainty what God's will in our lives might be, the way David did. But in David's case, God's interruption led to the revelation that DAVID would not build a house for God. God would build a house – a dynasty – for David! Life would not go according to plan for David – but there would be a future for David and his people. David was saying, "God, I'm pretty sure I have your plan figured out. Here I am." God's reply? "I don't need favors. Here is what I have in store for you. You won't build me a house... I will build a house... an everlasting dynasty... for you!"

We know how things turned out for David and for Mary. What will happen when the plans you and I have in mind seem to clash with God's purpose? Do we believe that God's plan for us is still in play? Jesus, the fulfillment of a promise God made long ago to David and the child God brought into the world through Mary, is all the proof we need that we too have the gift of a future. Even when life doesn't go according to plan.

What is the crossroads God has brought you to? Seeing God's promise unfold at Christmas again this year reminds of God's faithfulness. Together with Mary we can say, "Here I am." The love of God has found us... and holds us close. We may not know what tomorrow may hold, but we know the One who will be with us when we get there. The baby Jesus born in Bethlehem is proof that God's love is at the bottom of life. Leaning on God's abundant grace, we put our trust in Him.




## Sunday Morning Adult Christian Education

The Real St. Nick: Leader, Legend, or Lie? December 17, 9:30-10:30 am Fellowship Hall

This study examines a man who, next to Jesus Christ, is the most visible figure during the holidays – St. Nicholas or Santa Claus – as we know him in Western culture. Dating back to the 3rd century, St. Nick is attributed with the doing of many benevolent and charitable acts of kindness and generosity.

As with most anything passed down through the centuries, however, things have a way of becoming larger than life. Is he the great despoiler of Christmas or the persecuted confessor of the Christ? Is he a defender of the faith or one who undermines it?



We will largely determine what role Santa plays in our homes. This study, led by Pastor Alan Shaw, looks at the traditions and tries to sort out the usable from the discardable.


Middle School and High School
