Pastor's Corner for December 31-January 6

New Clothes (Isaiah 61:10-62:3)

Christmas 2023 is already in the history books. W hat did you get?

I remember a day when getting clothes for Christmas was not on the top of the list. (Not unless it came with an activity attached: gloves for skiing, shoes for hiking, that sort of thing!) Needless to say, things have changed over the years. While I'll always have my favorite old sweatshirts on hand for puttering around in the garden

outside or walking the dog (one of those favorite work shirts is over 30 years old), I'm always happy to get new stuff on special days like Christmas that make the New Year feel a little newer.

On this last weekend of 2023, the prophet Isaiah turns our attention to new clothes and the action of God to get us decked out and feeling like a million bucks. WE have not put on new duds, Isaiah reminds us. Rather, "[our] God" has "clothed [us] with garments of salvation; He has covered [us] with the robe of righteousness!" (61:10). It reminds me of how God took care of Adam and Eve's hopelessly inept effort to clothe themselves with fig leaves after their Fall in the Garden of Eden. God covered their shame with "garments of skins" (Gen 3:21). He ensured that they would thrive despite their failure with the one area of the Garden God had put off limits. You and I screw up too. The passing of one year to the next reminds us of the mistakes of 2023. But the Christmas Christ-child is God's gift of rescue! What did we get this year? We got Jesus —God's way of giving all of us a clean slate and fresh start for 2024.

The renewing work of the Lord to coax goodness and praise from the people of the world is also compared in our text to a garden unexpectedly sprouting and budding. Winter might be just beginning, but there are flowers —paperwhite narcissus (I had to Google that!) —already popping up near the circle drive at the entrance to RLC. When you come by this weekend, linger for a minute out front and take a look. May they remind you, as they reminded me today, that God is good and is sometimes doing His best work in a season in which we least expect to see it.
