Pastor's Corner for January 14-20, 2024

Your Right Hand Holds Me (Psalm 139:1-10)

Every day as I used to go to work in Tokyo, Japan I would pass an unusual work of art. It was a statue of Jesus with no arms. It stood at the top of the second-floor row of faculty offices at my school. Students and faculty would pass it all the time. Why would such an unconventional depiction of Jesus be placed there? You can imagine that the question would be easily formed in the minds of many students, some of whom were learning about Christianity but did not yet know a lot about Jesus. I myself used to wonder, when I first started working there, if the statue had at one time fallen to the ground and lost its arms in an unfortunate tumble. Jesus did many things with His hands: healed the sick, touched the untouchable, broke bread and prayed to the God of heaven. So... Jesus with no arms? It didn't make sense. Then one day I heard the college president explain: "The statue of Christ

with no arms speaks to our hearts in a voice that can be heard only quietly and almost imperceptibly: 'You are my hands. With those hands you can join hands with the neighbor who is by your side. You can put your arms around the shoulder of the person who is trembling in solitude and give them a hug.... You can put those hands together and pray for whatever you need.'" I never saw that statue in the same light ever again!

In this weekend's psalm, the psalmist who is speaking to God writes, "If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, your right hand shall hold me fast." Hands are a symbol of action and rescue. There is no place so far away from God that His guiding and protecting hands cannot reach us and bring us safely home! A faith community like ours is a place where we are gifted by God to be the hands and arms of Jesus. As we begin a new year, with a newly installed leadership team (our 2024 Church Council), I invite you to consider the One who holds all of us in His arms as we serve together. We take this opportunity to think about and celebrate how our own hands are a place for God's hands to be at work in the world.




Isaiah was called by God to speak His Word to a people who were committing spiritual adultery. Through Isaiah, God warned them to repent before the coming
