Pastor's Corner for January 28-February 3, 2024

Connecting with Purpose (1 Corinthians 8:1-13)

What's my purpose in life? It's a question that we might ask ourselves a lot. We wish we only had to ask the question once, upon graduating high school, entering the real world, we think that question will be our guide through the rest of our lives. We find our purpose and are sent out into the grand world to make a difference! If only. The question keeps popping up through different stages of life and even on random days, going through the motions we may ask, "What's my purpose? What am I called to do in the world? What difference am I making?"

As Christians, we may put even more pressure on the question. We think that, because we belong to God and know the life-saving message He has for the world, we should be doing something extravagant to make a difference or there should be some greater purpose for me in God's grand plan. Stories are often celebrated of those that "know their purpose" and are making big change in the church and the world, and we can judge our place before God by the actions of others. If we aren't making headway in our lives or in the lives of others, or if we have failed somewhere in our faith journey, we may be brought back to the question, "What's my purpose in life?"

The question is addressed all over the place in Scripture, though not in the way that we may expect. In 1 Corinthians 8, Paul is giving some guidance about why the Corinthians should or shouldn't eat food offered to idols. It's kind of an odd chapter, but in there is a message about our purpose and it starts with what God has done for us. That is where it always has to start!

Paul says, "yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist." We exist for God, our purpose is found in Him! In our existing for God the Father we exist as His creation, where God desires to be, a people created in His image to reside and abide with Him alone. Before there is any action on our part, we acknowledge that part of our purpose is to simply be with our Father God and the peace of His embrace, finding comfort in His purpose that brings eternal rest.

Paul continues in the same verse, "and there is one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist." Our very existence comes through the work of Jesus Christ, His work on the cross that brings the life of true existence. We have a purpose in this life because of the life that Christ has won for us in His death and resurrection. The answer to that age old question isn't so much about the actions we live out, it's the life God has accomplished for us, the gifts He gives, and the life we have waiting for us.

Because we exist for God and through God, we are connected with His purpose, which is nothing less and nothing more than loving others. There is no greater joy than knowing that we belong to something greater. We belong to the love of the

one God who has brought you into His eternal embrace.

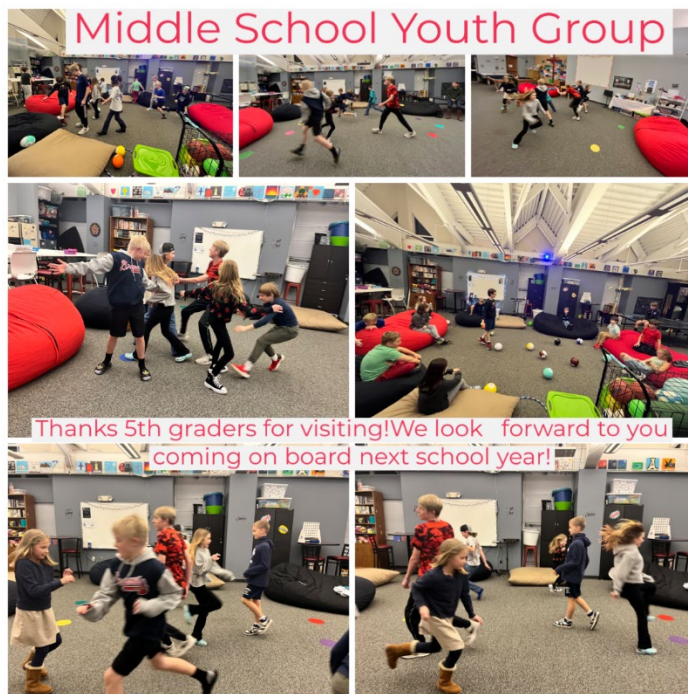
Middle School and High School

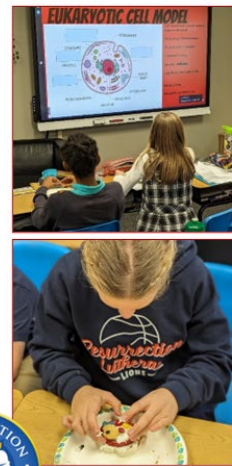
