Pastor's Corner for March 17-23, 2024

A Promise to Forget (Jeremiah 31:31-34)

I have a habit of forgetting pocketknives. Out of all the things there are out there to forget, pocketknives aren't a big deal, but I forgot them when I was of the age that a pocketknife was a statis symbol, not just a tool. The type of pocketknife you had said something about you, at least in a group of boys, except I kept forgetting them places. I've forgotten knives in bathroom stalls, my grandma's barn, at the lake, in the woodshed, even my own bedroom; forever laid to rest wherever they were last used.

Losing stuff is frustrating to say the least, sometimes bringing out the worst in us. As we are trying to rush out the door, forgetting where we put our keys, wallet, or phone we can become angry, panicked, flustered, even scared and we take those frustrations out on others all because we forgot where we put something, and we might be late for work. We hate forgetting stuff!

Well, God LOVES to forget stuff! God has made His people a promise to forget, and it is one of His greatest promises ever. God says in Jeremiah 31:34, "I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more." God forgets our sin! The language we normally use is "God forgives our sin", which is the same as saying, "God forgets our sin." To God, forgiving and forgetting are one and the same, they cannot be separated. His promise to forgive is the same as His promise to forget. It is impossible for God to remember our sin because if He did, then they would still exist, and they wouldn't truly be forgiven. But God's work is final, His forgiveness is final, what has been forgiven is forgotten. We have a God who promises to forget.

What do we normally say when someone has misplaced something? "Where did you last leave it?" Often, even though God has forgotten our sins, we still remember them, because it isn't as easy for us to forgive and forget. It is in those times, when we remember our sins, we ask God, either in wonder or terror, how He could ever truly forgive us, how could He ever truly forget our sins?? His answer is simple. He asks us, "Where did I leave your sins last?" And He points us to the cross, where our sins were nailed to that tree with Christ Himself, and that is where our sins were left and forgotten. We have a God who loves to forget.



Since 1989, Inter-Faith Food Shuttle (IFS) has recovered and distributed over a million pounds of food per year and has taught skills for self-sufficiency including culinary job skills, shopping and cooking healthy on a budget, and how to grow food. They service seven area counties, including Wake County, and their programs support low-income families living in 'food deserts' and without the income to purchase healthy meals. They partner with food providers, houses of worship, and community housing to distribute access free food at mobile markets where needy families live. IFS was started by two women, a Christian and a Jew, who wanted to recover and distribute food that would otherwise end up in landfills. (foodshuttle.org)

# Lutheran Braille Workers

Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) provides God's word – the Bible and other Christian materials) to people who are blind or visually impaired, completely free of charge, in quality formatted Braille and specialized large print, and in multiple languages.
