Pastor's Corner for March 24-30, 2024

Prisoners of Hope, Come Home (Zechariah 9:9-12)

One of the more interesting disciples of Christ I've learned about over the years is a Japanese pastor named Hiroyuki Suzuki. Pastor Suzuki was a former gang member: a yakuza. He often used to wear shirts in warmer weather that displayed his yakuza tattoos. His left and right hands both bore signs of gang affiliation and loyalty to his "bosses": severed fingers. Pastor Suzuki was the last man in the world you would expect to have become a Christian, let alone to have written a book or started a speaking tour to testify to his faith in Christ. But that was what God brought about. What's important is that Pastor Suzuki didn't try to hide who he was after coming to faith. He couldn't. His tattoos and severed fingers were one of the first things folks would notice about him. Rather than try to conceal his association with

organized crime, he used this evidence of his past life to speak about how even though HE once chose the lordship of a strong man who led him down the road of drug use and gambling — even though HE chose a path that promised momentary rewards instead of the eternal treasures — Christ delivered him. He was, in other words, a prisoner of false hopes, a man who had looked for life in the wrong places. God gave him freedom to confess the only Lord that really mattered: the Lord of the cross... the God who loves him and has given him a new beginning as the Lord of his life.

I remembered this pastor when I read the appointed Old Testament reading for this weekend from the prophet Zechariah. I suspect we all know this passage as the prophecy that foretold the triumphant entry into Jerusalem of a warrior king who would bring all conflict to an end and "speak peace to the nations." What I noticed this week as I read it is the call at the end of the passage to all who are "prisoners of hope" to come home. Ordinary hope is not always directed where it should be. But as Pastor Suzuki would discover, the isolation and conflict of past wrong decisions in life does not disqualify him — or any one of us — from the grace and mercy of God today! On that very first Palm Sunday, Jesus came humble, riding on a donkey, to deliver us. What He did would end with His cross and tomb. Yet as the crucified and risen Son of God, He does speak peace to the nations. The mystery is that He does it through wayward folks like us.

Join us again this weekend at RLC as we follow Jesus to the Upper Room (Maundy Thursday), Calvary's cross (Good Friday), and the empty tomb (Easter). There is lifechanging peace to be found at the end of Lent! To all who have put their hopes in what cannot bring true and lasting peace the call still goes out: Prisoners of hope... come home!


