Come, Holy Spirit!

(Galatians 5:22-23)

"Come, Holy Spirit!" Have you ever prayed that prayer before?

Here's an image for you: while you might have always thought of the Holy Spirit as the wind that moves a windmill or powers a sailboat... how about comparing the Holy Spirit to a parachute? Believe it or not, I recently had the chance to go skydiving. It was exhilarating. It was awesome. It was something I always wanted to do. And there's this unforgettable moment when the parachute opens. You go from a free fall with the wind rushing by you loud and intense one minute, to the opening of the chute and immediate quiet, the next. As you float gently down you can even survey the landscape around you. I've shared with



many of you how I often go to bed with the prayer "Come, Holy Spirit!" at the end of the day. I remind myself how, having received the Holy Spirit by God's grace, I can give thanks that I have also received God's comfort, peace, and love for me. The Holy Spirit and the Presence of the resurrected Lord Jesus with me "breaks my

fall" from the turmoil, emotion, and out-of-control energy that can make rest elusive. Or as St. Paul puts it, "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." The Holy Spirit doesn't just empower me to get going and carry out what I cannot "by my own reason and strength" pull off—though He does, at times, do that. There are also times when the Holy Spirit brings me from a "free fall" to a glide...from my natural inertia to a quiet "stop" when such a transition seems impossible for me. That's the gift that our crucified, risen, and ascended Savior and Lord brings us. Come, Holy Spirit!

Metaphors and the Figurative Language of the Bible

Sundays, 9:30-10:30 am Fellowship Hall April 7-May 19

Language is one of the most remarkable gifts that God has given us. The Bible makes extensive use of both literal and figurative language. If God is revealing only truth to us, why did He not speak simply in plain, straightforward language?

This series will identify many of the prominent metaphors found in Scripture and demonstrate the benefits that figurative language offers compared to more basic wording. Understanding the structure and the multilayered meanings of these metaphors will expand our appreciation of God's revelation and deepen our understanding of His allembracing love for us.

In the process, we will compare and contrast how the Bible's use of metaphors compares and contrasts with their function in poetry and in everyday speech.

Led by Larry Cameron. Handouts will be distributed at the start of each session; no other books are required. May at RLC is all about the gift of the Holy Spirit sometimes motivating and moving us to action and at other times bringing us the rest and quiet of sins forgiven. Whether it's the Rite of Confirmation for eleven RLC young people of our congregation who say "yes" to the promises others made for them at their baptism...the nuptials of RLC young adults this month who will be saying "yes" to the love of God that they pledge to live out in faithfulness to one another...or even just the ordinary opportunities we all have to say "yes" to bearing fruit in everyday circumstances...it is not just you and I who do it. The Holy Spirit, working through God's Word and Sacraments, powers us up and breaks our fall time and time and time again!

This month, let's not only receive the Holy Spirit together again, but live out the working of the Holy Spirit in us, by God's grace! Come, Holy Spirit!

Church Council News

April 2024

The report from our Treasurer and Finance Team showed remarkable improvement in giving during the month of March. Even though it was a five-week month, the average weekly giving improved. First let me thank you all. Our tithes help Resurrection Lutheran continue to spread God's Word to the Nations through its Worship Services, Music, Schools, Bible Studies, Youth Activities, and Mission Work. These final three months of our Fiscal Year are typically months RLC receives less offering income. Even so, God has been so good to us, so please join me and the Council as we prayerfully consider our giving of time, talents, and tithes.

All that we do at RLC, as a part of God's Mission, requires regular attention to the facilities of our church and schools. Therefore, the Council is overseeing the formation of a Facilities Management Team (FMT), to be led by Randy Bowling. A draft charter was presented to the Council this past month, and it is comprehensive. It includes:

- Church Grounds (e.g. exterior lighting, parking lot, landscape, etc.)
- All RLC Physical Assets (e.g. walls, flooring, plumbing, electrical, security, kitchens, seating, alarms, etc.)
- Large and Small Projects as needed, such as an upgrade to the Fellowship Hall/Kitchen area

The charter also formalizes things to properly plan for things in the budget and prevent overspending.

More good news on the Mission front – RLC is now formalizing all of our Mission Activities with a Cross-Cultural Mission Engagement Team (CCMET). This team includes Paul Brandt, Susan Brandt, David Birner, Ron Bostick, Erika Hulse, and Juli Blanke. Pastor Jonathan Blanke will be invited to attend meetings in an ex-officio capacity. The CCMET also presented a draft charter to the Council last month, and it is being finalized in the coming weeks. One of the most helpful functions in the Charter of the CCMET is to have more formal communications with the missionaries we support so RLC can better understand their needs and provide more meaningful support.

The Council is also starting to discuss the Music Ministry future at RLC as Bob Unger transitions to part time support toward the end of 2024. The really good news here, is Bob wants to continue as our Lead Organist and continue to support the music ministry as in the past. To make this a reality, others will be called on to help fill in some of the activities Bob has faithfully done for RLC (in the background).

Prison Alliance

The Lord is their shepherd; they shall not want.

Because of the generosity of Resurrection people, inmates will come to know Him as their shepherd.

On April 20-21, Ann Johnson shared information about Prison Alliance and their goal of providing 20,000 Bibles to the hands of inmates in U.S. prisons by June 30 at the cost of only \$5. They currently serve 8,000 Bible students behind bars and the number one request is to have a Bible.

We can now update the total to \$1,275 donated for Bibles to go to prison inmates! That buys 255 Bibles! Praise the Lord and the people of Resurrection Lutheran Church.

For anyone still wishing to make a monetary donation, please use the envelopes already stamped and addressed to Prison Alliance at the information centers. Also if you have gently-used Bibles to give, the bin under the coat rack in the hallway by the church mailboxes is available anytime.

Prison Alliance volunteers respond to a variety of letters received from inmates all over the country. Most of them fall into three categories: requesting to be enrolled in Bible studies, requesting a certain book or Bible, and/or asking for prayer. Harrison Hulse ('24) has grown from a shy, uncertain freshman into a confident, accomplished scholar and respected spiritual leader.

It's freshman move-in day on the CUW campus: August, 2020. The Covid-19 pandemic is in full swing as freshman Harrison Hulse sets foot on the bluff for the very first time; the pandemic made it impossible for him to visit before he enrolled.

Harrison, who had traveled from Apex, North Carolina (a suburb of Raleigh), to begin his Concordia journey, would be the first to admit CUW hadn't been his first choice. The U.S. Naval Academy, Duke, and UNC Chapel Hill were all higher on his list. But for different reasons, none of those schools worked out.

What did work out was an amazing four years as an outstanding student—and student leader—at CUW.

Harrison goes on to speak to the loss of his father, Randy, RLC's former Praise Worship Leader, and about the support of his mother, Erika, Children and Family Ministry Director and their influence on his career path.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace

Helping Children in Need Sleep Better

All children deserve a safe, comfortable place to lay their heads. Across the country, too many boys and girls go without a bed—or even a pillow—to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors. This can affect their happiness and health.

That's where Sleep in Heavenly Peace comes in. We are volunteers who are dedicated to building, assembling, and delivering top-notch bunk beds to children and families in need.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) provides the bed, mattress, and bedding to each child. Bedlessness is a real problem in the US with 2-3% of the population sleeping without beds.

A volunteer crew delivered to a family of three little girls that had all been sleeping on the same (broken) twin size bed. That same night, a bed was delivered to a 17-year-old that had never had a bed of his own.

SHP provides all the tools and expertise that allow people with little or no experience to build all the components for a solid, wood bunk bed. It is always a fun-filled half day that ends with branding the beds. Fellowship is wonderful and the ability to solve a problem for others leaves everyone feeling a bit better about the world!

Ambassadors of Reconciliation (AoR) is hosting a local in-person event (Regional Reception) for the Eastern Region. AoR is committed to help Christians and their churches live lifestyles of reconciliation by the power of the Gospel through the "ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself...and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, making his appeal through us." (2 Corinthians 5:18-20)




Youth Ministry News


"Snap Chat"
