# The Whole World (John 3:1-17)

In a class with the Middle Schoolers at Resurrection Lutheran School, when talking about our identities through a biblical worldview, we discovered that everyone on earth has three things in common:

- 1. Everyone is created by God (Psalm 139:13)
- 2. Everyone is loved by God (John 3:16)
- 3. Everyone needs God (Romans 3:23)

When we look at the world through the lens God provides, we see that this is true. This is how Jesus Himself speaks about the world. He would know best because He

has been there since the beginning! All people are part of God's creation, that's what God does as our Creator Father. Whether you believe it or not, that's the way it is. And because we are all created by God, then we are also all loved by Him. Part of God's identity is His love for His creation. God as Love and Creator cannot be separated, it is simply who He is. Since this is the greatness of our Loving, Creating God we, as His creatures, fall short of who God is. We are sinful, all of us. Everyone on earth is born into sinful creation. But the story doesn't stop there!

I don't think I'm overreaching to say that everyone reading this knows John 3:16. It is the best-known verse in all of God's Word and it speaks to these three things that everyone has in common. God loves the whole world because it is His creation, He made it and holds all of it closely in His strong right hand. Because He made every single portion of creation, He also knows our need for Him. He knows, and mourns, the sin that terrorizes our lives and impacts every single fiber of this universe. Because He knows this sin, He will not let us live in it alone. He can't, it is impossible for God to let us live in our sin without Him acting for us. He knows our need and because we are His creation and loved by Him, He will act. So, He gave His only Son for the whole world to believe in Him and not die eternally but live with their Loving, Creating Father God forever and ever and ever and ever!

It makes sense that John 3:16 is the best-known verse in the whole Bible, but we shouldn't stop there, verse 17 is just as important, "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him." Again, we see our three-fold, common identity with all creation. God has created us and loves us, so He does not want to condemn us, therefore He gives us a way out of the darkness and into His light. That is who God is, not one who condemns but the One who loves and loves so entirely that He acts for us to be with Him eternally.

Helping Children in Need Sleep Better

All children deserve a safe, comfortable place to lay their heads. Across the country, too many boys and girls go without a bed — or even a pillow — to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors. This can affect their happiness and health.

That's where Sleep in Heavenly Peace comes in. We are volunteers who are dedicated to building, assembling, and delivering top-notch bunk beds to children and families in need.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) provides the bed, mattress, and bedding to each child. Bedlessness is a real problem in the US with 2-3% of the population sleeping without beds.

A volunteer crew delivered to a family of three little girls that had all been sleeping on the same (broken) twin size bed. That same night, a bed was delivered to a 17-year-old that had never had a bed of his own.

SHP provides all the tools and expertise that allow people with little or no experience to build all the components for a solid, wood bunk bed. It is always a fun-filled half day that ends with branding the beds. Fellowship is wonderful and the ability to solve a problem for others leaves everyone feeling a bit better about the world!
