Pastor's Corner for June 2-8, 2024

Shoulders Relieved and Hands Freed (Psalm 81:1-10)

Every Sunday we pastors greet you as you come to church. It's one of the most important things we do. Sure, it's fun to see the people of RLC and engage in conversation a bit. It's also a way to hear a little about how things are going in your lives. Occasionally, as we ask this or that person how their day is going, we hear: "I almost didn't make it." The explanations can be either serious or lighthearted. It may be an illness that made it impossible or difficult to get out of bed... or car or garage door trouble... or even more challenges than usual getting the family out the door and into the car on time! As these brief conversations end, I can't help but wonder: When something as simple as observing Sabbath rest seems at times to take extra planning and even more exertion, what do most folks understand as the reason why they do it?

Whether our explanation for going to church is to serve others, is out of love for a family member who wants us there, to see friends, in response to the Commandment to “honor the Sabbath Day,” or because we relate to the message, the music, or the liturgy... in the end the reason God wants us there is for soul refreshment. He invites us to step into the sacred space of Sabbath rest because that’s what HE did after creating the cosmos (Gen 2:3) The appointed Psalm for this weekend calls our attention to what God did for Israel during Israel’s time of slavery in Egypt: God reminds Israel, “I relieved your shoulder of the burden; your hands were freed from the basket. In distress you called, and I delivered you.... I brought you up out of the land of Egypt. Open your mouth wide and I will fill it” (81:7-10). Corporate worship allows us to step out of the raging river that carries us along, day after day, telling us either what we should have done before or what we better/got to/have to do now. Entering sacred space together we have our burdens relieved and our hands freed. Stepping into Sabbath space entails receiving the love of the Father and the healing work of our Savior even or especially when we CAN’T perform. We all need that comfort and refreshment. THAT’S why God calls us to honor the Sabbath day.

This weekend a new sermon series on 2 Corinthians begins. Among other things, it underlines the need for that Sabbath rest. Our theme? “God’s strength in our weakness.”

Won’t you join us to see how God’s grace is all we truly need?
