From the Pastor When God Has a Better Idea

(2 Corinthians 12:9-10)

There's a dozen or so Bible verses that every pastor knows speak readily to folks who need to hear the promises of God amid life's wilderness experiences. One of those Bible verses that we often have ready to cite by chapter and verse is 2 Corinthians 12:9-10. In response to St. Paul's request that God alleviate some specific form of suffering he was enduring at that time—a mysterious "thorn in the flesh," as he calls it— God basically says "No": "My grace is sufficient for you," God says. "For my power is made perfect in weakness" (12:9).

With June at RLC begins a new series on 2 Corinthians entitled, "God's Strength...Our Weakness." It's an important focus. In the Scriptures we don't ever get a picture of God banishing hardship from the faith journey. Instead, we consistently see our need and God's sufficient grace side-by-side. Whether our "thorn in the flesh" happens to be related to physical health, our desire for gratitude, our yearning for



greater faith, courage, or something else, the Scriptures repeatedly teach us to look away from our lack and wait on God's "better idea." That includes the call to put aside our own need to be in control and learn to better lean on God and one another.

It's a life lesson that can be excruciatingly difficult to learn. I can confidently attest to that myself! But God's grace is, somehow, always sufficient. Always.

Activities at Resurrection in the month of June offer many ways to invite God's sufficient strength into our own—or our world's—weakness. I'd like to invite everyone at RLC to consider taking part in the fellowship

In May, the Council spent most of its time preparing for the Voter's Meeting coming up in June. The budget is the main topic and as we are closing out our Fiscal Year (FY - which ends on 30 June 2024), we are looking at "last-minute" expenses (some planned and some unplanned) such as tree removal, gym floor repairs, water heater failure (and subsequent damage), labor for window replacement earlier in the year, and maintenance contracts. Most committees and budget recipients have done a nice job of "tightening their belts" to keep the budget within reach this year. The Council is also looking to implement a reserve fund to ensure positive cash-on-hand for the many expenses we face. Please plan to attend the Voter's Meeting in the Family Life Center at 12:30 pm on Sunday, June 9th to find out more.

Keeping this update short, but one more item; a few members, including your RLC Council President, have expressed a need for cushions at the Communion Rails. A small team is being formed by the Council to address this as soon as possible.

Remembering God's Promises at Baptism

Dawson Berry was baptized as an early teenager and his faith journey over the years led him to better understand the significance of Word and Sacrament for the forgiveness of sins. He didn't know the exact date of his baptism and did not really celebrate the promise God made to him on an annual basis. With a little research, we were able to help find his baptismal record and the church gave him a tangible reminder (candle) marked with the date of his baptism (May 27) so he knew when to celebrate again.

That was about a month ago and it didn't seem like enough for someone celebrating his baptismal anniversary for the first time in many years and so Dawson and I made plans to meet at the church on May 27th and do something together. What a great experience it was for me to share that moment with Dawson. We went into the sanctuary, said a prayer thanking God for the gift of baptism, the washing away of our sins and marking us as children of God. We read aloud one of Dawson's favorite Bible verses, which fit very nicely into the occasion:



[Jesus said,] "For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day" (John 6:40). We lit the candle, said the Lord's Prayer, watched the candle burn down a little more and went to lunch. Nothing fancy, but what an experience.

I think it's possible to take occasions like the anniversary of a baptism for granted. I know I sometimes do. But even if we take it for granted, God doesn't take His promises to you and me for granted, and He never forgets them. Paul asks us, *"Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his (Romans 6:3-5).*

That's no small promise. And that (to me) means that it's no insignificant

anniversary to remember. We wait for the day to be united with Christ in a resurrection like His because of God's promise in baptism and because God's promise to raise us to eternal life. It was a day I was thankful to share with Dawson and I hope all of you look back on your day of baptism and remember God's promise to you. (Photo and story shared with permission.)



Outreach to the Community

Operation Inasmuch

During our church-wide day of service through Operation Inasmuch, 115 volunteers provided numerous acts of service to our church members, community and beyond. Volunteers put in close to 675 service hours providing service for the homeless, cancer patients, food insecure, supporting vulnerable women using their gifts to create beautiful crafts to provide income, youth with disabilities, providing cards of encouragement and love to our RLC family, friends, missionaries, military personnel and so much more.

Volunteers participated in 10 service projects, including sorting and organizing the food pantry at Western Wake Crisis Ministry (we donated 840 lbs. of food!), knitting hats for preemies at Wake Med, making quilts for Sleep In Heavenly peace and Lutheran World Relief, Project Linus making blankets for kids with cancer, playing baseball with Miracle League youth, building for Habitat for Humanity, maintenance and landscaping the RLC campus, sending cards of encouragement to our RLC family, missionaries, and service personnel and much more!

Special thanks to Thrivent Financial who provided \$1,750 for our Action Teams to buy materials and supplies for our day of service.

Ambassadors of Reconciliation (AoR) is hosting a local in-person event (Regional Reception) for the Eastern Region. AoR is committed to help Christians and their churches live lifestyles of reconciliation by the power of the Gospel through the "ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself...and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, making his appeal through us." (2 Corinthians 5:18-20)

We believe that God has called each person to live reconciled lives with everyone around them – with their spouse, family, co-workers, fellow church members, other believers – to the glory of God. What does it look like to live a lifestyle of reconciliation? What if I disagree with someone? What if I have been wronged? What if I just don't understand someone else? What am I called to and what is just unrealistic? We hope to shed light on these important questions together.

This short but impactful event is held over a 24-hour period over 2 days. It promotes a time of fellowship with like-minded people, an opportunity to network and growing together over meals, main sessions and casual conversations. Longer workshops cover a variety of topics and help to answer some of the most relevant questions about relationships.


