(Genesis 9:8-17)

One of my fondest memories of family trips in the car with our kids, Sarah and Joel, was what happened AFTER we drove through a deluge on the highway. We'd pass through the storm with sunshine ahead while dark angry clouds continued to drop rain behind us. Someone would spot a rainbow on the horizon. "Look... it's a rainbow!" they would say. Everyone would immediately turn to marvel at this miracle of water and light glistening in the afternoon sun.


Ever stopped to consider how differently we might envision the relationship between humanity and nature WITHOUT Noah, WITHOUT the animals, WITHOUT the ark, and WITHOUT the rainbow? Without the rainbow after that terrible flood, we might be inclined to believe
