Pastor's Corner for August 18-24, 2024

God's Call (Ephesians 5:6-21)

I'll always remember the first time I heard someone talk about what God was telling them to do. It was the summer before senior year of high school, and I was talking with a recent graduate. I asked her about the local university I knew she was going to, but then she told me she wasn't going to college anymore. She explained that God was calling her in a different direction.

I didn't really know what to make of that. I was a pastor's kid (still am), went to church my whole life, Sunday school, youth group, and all the rest but I never really thought about what God wanted me to do. I knew the 10 Commandments, or at least the "important ones", and that He wanted me to tell people about Him, but those were things He wanted all His people to do. What was God calling me to? I had no idea.

Have you thought about that question lately? When was the last time you sat and listened for God's direction in your life? I'll be honest, I was a little skeptical when my friend was talking about her relationship with God, but now I think there is something to learn from her experience. Whether or not she was right in her decision, she was absolutely right in listening for God's call and His guidance in life. In a short passage, Paul twice tells us to follow God's direction...

"try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord" (v. 10) 
"understand what the will of the Lord is" (v. 17)
```

Every baptized child of God who lives in His Kingdom-Church has a calling, a vocation, that God has brought them too. It didn't have to be dramatic or even a call you chose, but you are living in it right now. So what is "pleasing to the Lord" and "the will of the Lord" in your life today?

While it may be lived out in different ways, all of God's people are given the same guidance to "walk as children of light" (v. 8). Right after Paul tells us to understand the Lord's will, we are told where God finds joy and what His will is...

- 1. Be filled with the Holy Spirit, not the things of this world (v. 18)
- 2. Speak to each other with praise and thanksgiving (v. 19)
- Speak to God with praise and thanksgiving, actually talk with Him (vv. 19-2
- 4. Put yourself lower than everyone else because that's what Jesus did for you (v. 21)

No matter your vocation or calling, no matter what God has given you to do, the will of God and what He finds pleasing is the same for all of us. Don't burden yourself over what God wants you to do, instead find joy in knowing that He has

accomplished all things for and walk in that joy by loving and growing where we are.


