From the Pastor

Fearfully and Wonderfully Made... For God's Glory

(Psalm 139:14; 3 John 1:2)

The 3rd Letter of St. John is the shortest book in the Bible. At only 15 verses, there isn't any room for extraneous detail! But inside this short and to-the-point epistle there is an ordinary phrase spoken from one friend in Christ Jesus to another that might just easily be spoken between any two of us: "Dear friend, I pray that you might enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, just as it is well with your soul."

Not everyone can claim to be living out the blessing of "good health" as that may have been envisioned by the writer of 3 John. But whatever measure of health we or the people we love enjoy, it is always a gift from God's hand. It is something we tend to take for granted. The Scriptures speak about the gift and mystery of physical wellness:

"You formed my inward parts; You knitted me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made" (Ps 139:14). They also speak about what our bodies and minds are FOR: "Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6:19). The gift of physical, emotional, and mental health is a marvel! Together with all the other gifts we receive from our God it is worthy of our gratitude and thanks. Yet even as wonderful as the health of our bodies and minds might be, it is for God's glory... not our own.

Last month I was privileged to meet with several of you at RLC who have experience in the medical field. I'm grateful that these folks have chosen to join our congregation's newly formed "Stewardship of Life and Health Team." With roughly 20 current or former medical professionals and people interested in maintaining physical and mental wellness involved, I see this as an invitation to minister to one another and our community. Here are just a few ideas of how members of our new Life and Health Team could serve:

- Have people regularly in our worship services equipped to respond in the event of a medical emergency;
- Encourage one another to get involved in fitness activities that promote wellness and social connection (e.g., RLC's "[Emmaus Way](#)");
- Partner with local health organizations to offer free/low-cost health screenings or check-ups;
- Provide information on a variety of topics important to our church members (when to consider palliative care, questions/concerns about anesthesia, what sort of networks can be helpful for caring for a family member with dementia, etc.);
- Other ideas?

No matter what measure of health we enjoy, how can we take care of others if we don't properly care for ourselves? May God grant us to share—and receive—the wisdom to use our physical, mental, and emotional health for His glory and the furthering of His kingdom!

September 2024

The September Council learned that the funds received for Gutters, Windows, and HVAC are sufficient to begin the gutter replacement. Bids are now being requested from roofing contractors. Projects recently completed were replacement of the built-in refrigerator in the Fellowship Hall Kitchen, and repair of the walk-in refrigerator in the Family Life Center. The next big project on the horizon is a major overhaul of one of the HVACs in the Family Life Center. The Facility Management Team is also reviewing other near-term and long-term items that need attention.

The Council continues to build the much-needed charter documentation for the committees and teams at RLC. A draft of the Human Care Committee Charter was presented at the September Council Meeting and should be approved within the next couple of months.

Terms for three members of the RLC Council will end this coming December. If you or any others you know are interested in serving as a Council Member for Resurrection, please let one of us know.

Hope Beyond an Empty Cradle

We continue our journey to highlight an RLC Stephen Ministry theme each month and how Stephen Ministers help support people who may be experiencing life challenges. One of the main things people associate with Stephen Ministry is helping people through grief, and so it isn't surprising that the next couple of themed months will focus on different aspects of grief.

In October, and specifically on October 15th, we recognize National Infancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month. There are no words for parents who lose a child either prior to birth or during early childhood. And there is literally no word to describe a parent who loses their child: children can be "orphans"; spouses may be a "widow/er", but there is no word to describe parents who lose a child.

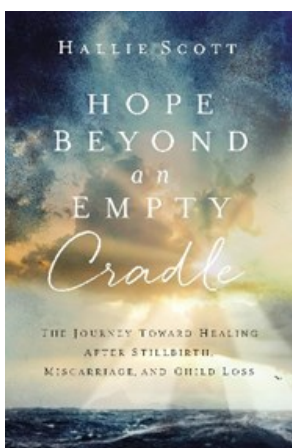
Stephen Ministry can be a great resource when there are no words to describe the loss and no words to describe the emotion. While Stephen Ministry is not

designed to replace professionally trained counselors or medical providers, we are well-equipped to support people during challenging times in life. The Christ-centered approach provides a message of hope. Stephen Ministers are called "Care Givers", but we know that only Christ is the "Cure Giver". It is through that relationship that Stephen Ministers can be that safe space for people to express their grief. It is our "ministry of presence" and sometimes all people need is to know that someone is with them.

Habitat for Humanity

Habitat of Wake County will be starting another Faith Coalition build in the Old Poole Place neighborhood on **October 12**. This event will include Lutheran, Catholic, Presbyterian, and South Wake coalitions, so you'll have an opportunity to work on multiple homes with folks from these other faith groups.

Day 1 - October 12: Wall Build and Standing of Walls

We need 4-6 RLC Volunteers. There will be 2 shifts you can sign up for that day. Shift 1 at 8:15 am or Shift 2 at 10:30 am. Both will be at the Habitat construction warehouse, 3301 Jones Sausage Road.

Shift 1 will build walls, then participate in a Kick-Off Ceremony and lunch, and then take walls to the site to stand them up.

Shift 2 arrives at 10:30 am to join the ceremony and lunch, and then build a second set of walls. Those walls will be taken to the site another day.
